The Main Event

Curly announced that he has met with the Hearth & Kettle over a proposed price increase. It's been discussed with the board. H&K's price is going from \$7.75 per person to \$12.50 per person. We have not seen any type of price increase in the past 7 – 8 years. Therefore the price to come to breakfast will go to \$15.00 beginning next week.

DG Steve Albright, introduced Michael McGovern from the Rotary Club of South Portland/Cape Elizabeth, ME as our guest speaker. Michael joined Rotary in 1986 and has served as Club President, District Governor, RI Zone Director and RI Vice President. Michael currently serves as the Chair, Rotary International PolioPlus Committee.

Michael spoke about various experiences he has had, traveling the world for Rotary and how most of them are linked back to the Rotary Foundation.

On one of his trips he was taken to a cemetery where the founder of our Rotary Foundation, Arch Klump was buried. Also buried there was John D. Rockefeller. His comparison was of the two headstones for both founders of large foundations. A very small modest one for Arch Klump and an enormous one for John Rockefeller signifying the greatness or power of this man. He went on to say that if you looked at both the Rotary Foundation and The Rockefeller Foundation you would see that the Rotary Foundation gives out 1 ½ times as many grants as the Rockefeller Foundation. Size is not everything!

On another trip he was in Manilla for 5 days and was taken to many projects that the Rotarians in Manilla had done. The first one was a simple Child Care Center. He was handed a baby that was found in a gutter and brought to the Child Care Center. If Rotarians had not funded that center or not paid the wages of the workers working there this found baby wouldn't be alive today. Another stop was to a milk harvesting center, where Rotarians purchased all of the equipment for this center. This center harvests baby milk from mothers, purifies it and provides it to mothers that can't produce enough milk.

The next stop was a birthing hospital. The center was funded by Rotarians, and all equipment purchased by Rotarians. The big difference here compared to our modern hospitals was that there were about 300 beds in one room and in each bed two or three mothers. Still a huge difference and benefit for these women and children from what they had previously.

The last one was when he was out giving the Polio vaccine and a boy afflicted with Polio came up to another volunteer and was tugging on his pant legs. The boy had a big smile on his face and said thank you to the volunteer. He said the little girl that he just gave the vaccine to was his little sister and she would never be like him.

Our Polio efforts have achieved significant results. 18 million people are not paralyzed by polio because of our efforts. 2.5 billion children have been immunized. We have eradicated Polio from 125 countries worldwide. 25 years of no new polio cases in the Americas. Over 3 years of no new polio cases in Africa. All the additional benefits of the Plus in PolioPlus. Michael thanked everybody for their generosity to the foundation and urge us to continue our giving.
