Guest Speaker Annie Gibbons, Andrea Holden Thanksgiving Race – Annie Gibbons is a well-known personal trainer who owns One on One Personal Fitness Training and is the co-Founder and co-director of the Andrea Holden Foundation/Race. The Andrea Holden Foundation began in 2001 and this year will mark the 16th Annual Andrea Holden Thanksgiving Race. This race is held in memory of Andrea Holden who died suddenly on November 27, 1990 after celebrating her 7th birthday. All funds raised go to benefit the health and well-being of children in the Mid-Cape area. Andrea was a 7 year old girl in first grade, stomach flu but passed in the night. Betsy, Andrea's mother, was coping through exercise. Annie met Betsy in running group. They ran races together and decided to put on their own event the Saturday after Thanksgiving. There are many back-stories intertwined in the race, and this is one way that people understand the impact and how personal the involvement is with this race. Many families participate together after 3 days of eating. They need to get out and race and just get moving. Entire families, dogs, kids, walk, run, and participate and the group has never increased the \$18 registration fee so families can participate in the race together.



SaftiNet Bracelet Presentation by Kevin Lennon – The Rotary Club of Yarmouth was awarded a District Grant to purchase 6 SaftiNet bracelets for Yarmouth residents needing them. These bracelets allow the Yarmouth Police Department the ability to track down those individuals who may wander without caregivers knowing. Individuals in the community will need to be identified by the Senior Center, social service agencies, and care givers who have Alzheimer's, dementia, or are at-risk for wandering. The f amilies will be able to use the bracelet for 1 year and caregivers/family members will contact the YPD if the person goes missing. There are 12 officers trained to be able to pinpoint the location of the individual and use State Police helicopter backup to extend the range. This technology becomes part of the ongoing search and rescue capabilities of the YPD and State Police.

**MEMBERSHIP:** Membership in Rotary International has remained steady at 1.2 million members worldwide. Unfortunately, North America, especially the USA has seen a drastic decline in members for the past twenty-five years. This decline in membership has resulted in the loss of Zones in North America during the last two major restructurings that occurred in Rotary. What does this mean? It means that 8 years ago the USA lost one zone and in the most recent restructuring the USA lost two zones. Other growing parts of the world like India, Africa and the Far East gained the zones and the representation (Zone President) at Rotary International that went with these zones. As you can see Rotary has maintained the same number of members worldwide but we in the USA have lost a significant number of members. This is an important issue that everybody in Rotary is trying to address. As we lose members and the zones that go with them, we lose important representation and the decision-making leadership at the highest levels of Rotary. Rotary has made Membership it's number one priority in its new strategic plan. The plan addresses *club* innovation and flexibility, participate in a variety of service activities, promote membership diversity, improve member recruitment, develop leaders, start new dynamic clubs, encourage strategic planning at club and district levels. All of us can help grow our membership by inviting friends, relatives and business professionals to join us
