Our Exchange Student in Taiwan

I have a good set of friends at school and I talk with my host parents quite comfortable since there is very little language barrier. The only thing I struggle with is explaining to people who are not familiar with where I am from. I tell them I am from the USA and would think that I was joking but I am really not.... I do not really mind it but it is annoying sometimes. I sometimes get to see other exchange students, especially the ones that look really foreign. Since I am most of the time a translator to those exchange students and their families I am caught right in the middle of it. I have to explain to the parents and the exchange students the cultural differences. It helps me to really understand exchange students struggles.

I find that Taiwan is so much more environmental than we were in the USA, The students will follow the rules that the students in the USA would ignore. They would recycle trash into 5 or 6 categories and for some of the categories they would have to clean and wash their containers before they recycle them. There are also no trash cans in the street and people will not litter at all. Finding a trash can is as hard as finding gold. I did not realize that we have so many more trash cans in the USA until I came to Taiwan.

I am not feeling homesick at all but there are sometimes that I miss certain things like deli sandwiches and cereal. I am enjoying my exchange so much and am so delighted here.
