October 7 (8 am) is the date for the Cape Cod Healthcare blood mobile to arrive at the H & K Shopping Plaza and be prepared to screen for and to accept blood donations. As a welcome tie-in to the event was the presentation from Jonathan DeCoste, the Senior Blood Drive Recruiter for Cape Cod Healthcare, as he recounted the impressive efforts of local Rotarians and Rotary Clubs in fundraising and securing sponsors toward securing this much needed community service of Cape Cod Healthcare. One in seven patients who enter the Cape hospitals has a need for donated blood units due to a wide range of medical issues.

As a case in point, **Jonathan** related the dramatic story of his newborn son Jack's life-threatening heart condition in 2007. Without any advanced clues, this small child required an incredible number of hospital visits and numerous blood units in order to remain alive, be diagnosed, undergo treatment, survive, and now is thriving. It was a strong story underscoring the need for local and sustainable blood donation availability. Since coming "online" a year ago, the Cape Cod Healthcare blood mobile has made over 250 blood drives and collected 4500 units toward their need of 7500 units.
