She was paralyzed from the neck down at 19 and she needed to relearn how to walk Guillain Barre. She was told then that she would never walk, have children, or be productive. At ages 25 and 27 had her children and has successfully built a career. She was a successful Mary Kay consultant and even earned her pink car! They then moved to western Massachusetts to a small community of only 700 people. She then went to Mount Holyoke college and worked full time at the local school district as a grant writer, but eventually she was writing grants to keep her job. She didn't finish her degree at Mount Holyoke because she loved her job and decided to focus on that. She resigned from the school district and then wrote her own degree in Community Development at UMass Amherst. While working in Shelburne, she was approached by filmmakers to film in town and put the town on the map for production. She took great pride in aiding the businesses and negotiate with the film industry and focus on film tourism to help the community. She won the most prestigious award in the state for tourism. She was interviewed and got the job offer on her second interview at the Yarmouth Chamber and has loved her decision. She is currently on working many projects to help businesses in town including tapping into the fiber that is running along Route 28.
