<div>Rising Star - Cape Cod Tech - Guidance counselor introduced this month’s rising star, Marcella Larabe, Junior in HVAC shop at CC Tech, responsible and poised, wanted to take most rigorous courses available to prepare for college and study mechanical or chemical engineering. Completed summer work while working full time. Leadership capabilities and ability to work Independently. National Technical Honor Society for achieving a high GPA, looking forward to college and beyond!</div> <div>Guest Speaker Mike Riley on Scouting – Mike began my inviting a girls den from Pack 59 in Yarmouth to recite the Scout Oath and Scout Law. The girls also led the club in the Pledge of Allegiance to start the meeting. In total, Scouts in the Cape and Island Council logged 7,590 hours of community service hours last year. There were 43 boys that earned the rank of Eagle Scout last year. The national average is about 4% of Boy Scouts become Eagle Scouts. For the Cape and Island Council, that number is closer to 10%! Mike stated that finances and transportation are largest barriers for many, a trend for the past 10 years, and Scoutreach helps remove that barrier. The Scoutreach program serves over 100 low income and at risk youth throughout the community. This is an after-school activity at the DY elementary schools.</div> <div>Mike then spoke about Camp Greenough, which is situated on 300 acres of land off of Pine Street in Yarmouthport. Within Greenough, there are many programs include Project COPE, which is a team building ropes course. The Academic Leadership Institute, ALI, is an annual program that teaches teens how to get along, work together, and more. The camp offers shooting sports, including BB guns, archery, .22 rifle, shotgun, and black powder. There are many Cub Scouts and Boy Scouts events throughout the year which allow Scouts and their families’ access to the facility. During the summer, there is a coed Cub Scout Day Camp, which allows school-aged children to participate and learn arts and crafts, outdoor skills, swimming, fishing, kayaking, shooting sports, and more.</div> <div>What’s new in Scouting? Girls in Scouting! Many parents over the years have asked, “Why can’t my daughter be a Cub Scout?” The Boy Scouts of America, the parent organization, received many comments from parents and families and an internal review of the many question at stake in letting girls participate: “Are the principles of the Scout Oath and Law gender specific?” The answer is and was no, so now in Cub Scouting, boys and girls in Kindergarten through 5th grades are welcome to participate. This can be done through girl and boy dens, where the dens go over the same curriculum in separate dens. They meet monthly all together at Pack meetings, where awards are presented and they participate in the many outings active packs participate in.</div> <div>Changes to Boy Scouting: Currently, Boy Scouting is for boys in the 6th to 12th grades. Girls will be allowed beginning in February of 2019. National Council will be changing the name of the program from Boy Scouting to Scouts BSA. Troops must be separate for boys and girls. There will be at least 4 new troops being formed on the Cape with the same curriculum for both boys and girls. Girls will be eligible to earn the Eagle Scout award because it’s the same program, probably around December 2020. A requirement of an all-girl troop is that at least one troop leader must be a woman.
