The Main Event

• Jackie Carnevalli – Maktha School Update

Jackie updated us on the Maktha School and at this point, some students have graduated and been accepted to go beyond high school. High school ends at Grade 10 and college is generally similar to the last 2 years of high school. In India, a basic level of education is 8th grade. Polytechnic is 3 years and the focus is a science/engineering background. They are actively pushing interested students towards this so they are able to find jobs after completing their education. Jackie stated that most kids that go to school beyond high school are not coming from slums, so the expenses are generally for non-tuition related such as books, English language classes, etc.

Jackie then updated us on several of the students, such as D Pochamma, who wants to be a teacher and is pursuing intermediate school currently. Anusha has begun a polytechnic school. Ravi, the Director of the school, has assigned a mentor to each of the students graduating from Maktha to follow through with the students. Most parents do not read or write, so it is important to have a liaison and someone to be accountable to. He will provide monthly reporting and touch points.

In the postsecondary program, each student has a mentor to provide support, guidance and routine contact at the campus. They routinely meet to talk about challenges and opportunities and learn soft skills such as shaking hands, etc. University grads then join the inspiring young professionals, and when they are able, the students are encouraged to give back to the foundation.

The Carnevalli Foundation is situated so it will continue on into the future with some grads who will be on the board of directors to continue in perpetuity. In 2011/12 Maktha – Yarmouth Rotary decided to support and in 5 years, has done amazing renovations. Two members, Tammy and Mike Riley, have visited the school and anyone else is welcome to visit as well. Through the International Grant as well as club support, the following infrastructure improvements have been made: RO System for potable drinking water, boys and girls toilets, cooking shed, bore well, library, boundary wall and gate, early childhood center and playground, classrooms.

For next steps, Jackie asked the club, “What’s next? Will the club continue the relationship or focus on another part of the world? Should we submit another international grant?” Regardless of what the Club decides to do, available today are student sponsorships of high school grads for \$250 per year. These are individual sponsorships of high school grads and Jackie can be contacted for more information.
