GUEST SPEAKER: CURLY CAREY ON THE MIND OF A MARATHONER

Gerald ("Curly") Carey is known for being more of a direct-action type of person, rather than someone who stands on formality. So it should not come as much of a surprise to learn from his own telling of his own story that when his life was in a downward direction (such as in 1997 when his mother passed away) and he was in a "life crash," he found enough motivation to run his first Boston Marathon in 1999. He discovered then and in subsequent runs, that long-distance running is less the physical part and more the "80% between the ears."

The more he ran, the more he loved it. The more he loved it, the more he began to "raise awareness and funds for the community" as a marathoner. He ran 14 Boston marathons in a row. When he lost his father four years ago, he knew what he must continue to do. He stayed inspired (and without him saying it, he stayed inspirational to the community.) He may not run as fast as he used to (although he did finish the New York marathon in 3:59.5!), and he may need an occasional MRI, but Curly tells the community, "It's the finish line, not the finish time."
