## The Main Event

### **GUEST SPEAKER: KRISTINE DAVID, DISTRICT GOVERNOR (DIST. 7950)**

**District Governor Kristine Musco David** joined the Rotary Club of Cumberland-Lincoln in May 1992. She transferred to the Woonasquatucket Valley Rotary Club in North Providence (1995) where she became President (1999-2000). She subsequently came to the Providence Rotary (2003) where she was been extremely active in club committees and on the Board of Directors. She served as Assistant Governor (2004-2005) and Co-Chaired the District Conference in Bermuda.

**Kris** has been involved in Rotary youth and Foundation programs since joining Rotary. She has served at the District level as Interact Chair and Youth Exchange Chair. She has been the counselor for many of Ambassadorial Scholars and has hosted Group Study Teams in her home. In 2010, she was part of a group of Providence and Woonsocket Rotarians that traveled to the Dominican Republic to complete a Water Filter/Literacy Project.

She grew up in the Chicago area, graduating from Hope College in Holland, Michigan. After college graduation, she worked in Rhode Island, California, and Massachusetts with people with developmental disabilities and Alzheimer's disease. **Kris** established her consultant firm, K. David Associates, in 1996. She is now "retired." She resides in Warwick, Rhode Island with her husband, **Bill**, also a Rotarian. They have two children, **Gabriella** and **Alex**, who reside in California. (**Bill** is a Past President, a Past Area Rep, and a Paul Harris Fellow. **Bill** was a Rotarian prior to 1987 when RI changed the By-laws to start admitting women. Even then, **Kris** was a part of Rotarian through her work as a "Rotary-Ann.")

**DG Kris**, as part of the wide scope of her official responsibilities, makes at least one official visit to each club within Rotary District 7950. She began her presentation with a shout-out to former Exchange Student **Daje Weber-Trebesch** who was back from Germany on a visit. **Kris** went on to present a view of the unfinished progress of the worldwide campaign to eradicate polio: Pakistan has been now one-year polio free – first time ever! However, there is deep concern that existing international turmoil might contribute to outbreaks, even in Europe. October 24 is World Polio Day.

This is a time not to compromise, but to strengthen the Rotary membership commitment • to Rotary values and principals, • to be advocates for positive change, • to be open for new ideas and new ways of operating, such project partnerships, and • to engage new and younger members right away after coming into the club.
