Guest Speaker Elena Schuck – Elena spoke today about a STREAM event, Science, Technology, Reading, Engineering, and Math, that will be held in March for all families to participate in from K-12. This literacy event is focused on engaging families and promoting literacy, not just in reading books, but in applying it to all aspects of life.

- **Science** – This event will feature many science tables, where families will learn and participate in science based learning together
- **Technology** – Attendees will be exposed to various types of technology, the most popular being a green screen camera which can literally take a family anywhere in the world
- **Reading** – Of course, being a literacy event, reading is no surprise! There will be a panel of authors at the event available to ask and answer questions.
- **Engineering** – There will be various challenges to build and solve problems together as a family.
- **Math** – Math is everyone and is vitally important to literacy. In this event, following directions and proportions in ingredients listings are a part of discovering and learning together

Elena let us know that the impetus of this event is due to the disparity of reading levels and exposure to literacy that is varied by income levels locally and globally. She stated that by the age of 4, children whose parents are professionals, who have books at home and generally read quite a bit will be exposed to around 45 million words. Children of working class families are exposed to approximately 26 million words by the age of 4. Those from families in poverty are exposed to about 13 million words by the same age of 4. This event is to help introduce kids to literature, speaking, problem solving, and being cognizant to the world around them, which will help them to be successful adults.

Elena concluded by giving each table a challenge to build a structure with spaghetti, a marshmallow, string, tape, and a set of simple instructions: build the highest structure using these ingredients.
