Janice Matheson welcomed a returning Guest Speaker, Kathi Bailey, Director of Senior Services for the Town of Yarmouth. **Kathi** was on hand to introduce and promote a new initiative within the town of Yarmouth, the Age Friendly Community Team. This outreach program is funded under a grant from the World Health Organization as part of their international effort to identify and support "global age-friendly cities." On ly Boston and Yarmouth have been selected within Massachusetts as part of the *Aging America Project*. We are looking forward to hearing about these two young people as the year progresses


