**Guest Speaker Bea Gremlich from the Cape Cod Healthcare Foundation**– Bea spoke to the club regarding her role as Director of the Cape Cod Healthcare Foundation (CCHF) and Philanthropy Partners Cape Cod. She stated that currently the healthcare landscape is complex and challenging, especially given the various demographics on Cape Cod. She asked, “How do we manage to a fixed budget? How can we increase the value we deliver? How can we do better for the communities we serve?” Critical issues facing CCHF are reducing cost structures and overall cost of care, developing programs relevant to the community, and developing strong physician support for the various programs.

“What will it take to ensure Cape Cod Healthcare is here for the long-term? Do we remain traditional or expand services and move forward?” She cited that the CCHF and system as a whole are moving forward to expand and provide the best care right here on Cape Cod. She cited the hiring of a 5<sup>th</sup> neurosurgeon with critical brain, neck and spine care as an example of the exemplary care that can be found right here on the peninsula, where most hospitals would not be able to provide such services. Her role is to raise funds necessary to ensure that the technologies and staff are second to none. A key to this is modernization and access to all residents and visitors alike. “Philanthropy plays a key role in this. Community has always been paramount in giving back to community. People here care about everyone getting equal access to care,” she said.

The CCHF is kicking off a new campaign – dedicated to advancing care and inspiring hope. This is an optimistic outlook that not only treat when sick but help stay well. She mentioned the exceptional cancer services through skilled, talented staff and synchronicity with latest treatments. The overall goal is to fund future initiatives and long term strategic development.

Bea also spoke of the Light Keepers Program, which is reserved for those who give at a level of \$5,000 or more annually. This status helps the 5,200 employees allow these patients navigate the healthcare system with an advocate/guide to help deliver the best care possible.
