The Main Event

Service Academy & Congressional Nomination Process

Basic eligibility requirements are that you must be between the ages of 17 to 23, a US Citizen, Unmarried, not pregnant, and have no legal obligation to support another individual. You must have good moral character and no police record.

In Scholastics they must have taken 4 years of math including 1 year of Algebra. Must have taken 4 years of science to include 1 year of chemistry, 4 years of Social Studies to include 1 year of US History. Must have completed 2 years of a foreign language, a GPA of 3.2 or better and receive a minimum of 600 each in both Verbal and Math on the SATs.

For athletics students must have participated in all 4 years in school. It could be a high school team, community team or club team. Sport can be different all 4 years, but preference is a consistent sport or team.

Extracurricular activities are also important. School clubs, community organizations, and honor societies are all options. Preference is those that show evidence of leadership. A part time job can replace extracurricular activities.

Applicants must take a physical aptitude test. It must be administered by a Coach, Gym teacher, or Blue and Gold Officer. Things tested and timed include 1 mile run, pull ups, push-ups, abdominal crunches, 40-yard shuttle run, and kneeling basketball throw.

Applicants must also be able to pass a medical exam. It is scheduled and administered by DOD medical examiners. Things that may disqualify a candidate include cardiac, endocrine, and orthopedic histories. Precious eye surgery, a nut allergy, asthma, ADD/ADHD also can disqualify you. Must have been off RX for up to a year. Each case is renewed individually on a case-by-case basis.

Personal statement of interest must be written and answer the question "Why are you seeking an appointment to the Academy" Applicants must also get recommendations from Math and English Teachers, 4 year transcript from Guidance department and an interview from a Blue and Gold Officer.

The admissions board consists of representatives of all academic departments, Commandant staff, admissions department, athletics, medical. Typically, 25% to 30% reapply annually. 4 options of decisions Appoint, Conditional, NAPS, Turn-Down.

A nomination is required. Each candidate must receive a nomination from a US Representative or Senator. President or Vice President nomination. Secretary of a Service Branch. Son or daughter of Disabled Vet 100% , POW.

At the end of the day what is important is will the person be the best candidate to represent the 9th district.
