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PROGRAMS IN NEED!

SAFE HOUSING FOR OUR AT RISK YOUTH

Matanya's Hope's needs are changing. The urgency to continue housing our at risk young children and teen girls remains critical. We need your DONATIONS to provide these healing environments for children who have no one else to care for them. Some Kenyan families sell their young girls to older suitors, looking to offload them and to gain wealth in exchange. The girl child is rarely considered to be of value in many of the very rural Kenyan areas. Many of the boys born into abject poverty are often set free to roam without the support of food, structure and guidance. They don't go to school; they must do manual labor in exchange for food.

Please help us keep our children safe as we continue to love and guide them, teaching them of their incredible value as precious human beings.

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OUR SUCCESS STORY: FEATURING JANET WATIRI WANJIKU

My name is Neil Dutta; I am a junior Board Member for Matanya's Hope. This past July, I traveled to Kenya and was privileged to meet and interview Matanya's Hope alumna, Ms. Janet Watiri Wanjiku and Fanwell Thuranira - along with Matanya's Hope High School student: Yvonne Kiong'a. I was thrilled to spend time with them all in the rural town of Nanyuki which is situated at the base of Mt Kenya.

In this edition, I share with you my interview with Ms. Janet.

After just a few minutes of conversation, we became friends, and this greatly impacted the outcome of our interview. However, when I returned to the United States, I realized that the sound quality of our initial interview was poor and we decided to redo the interview via a Zoom call.

During this second interview, I also had the pleasure of meeting Janet's 1 year old son, Denzel, who was incredibly adorable.

Throughout our conversation, Ms. Janet shared her remarkable story of hope, hopelessness and endurance as she recounted her childhood hardships, which to me, were unimaginable. Ms Janet was raised by her single mother, who was forced into prostitution to provide for her two daughters. Ms. Janet and her younger sister endured severe challenges, including abuse, school bullying, hunger, and neglect. When Ms Janet's mother was arrested, Ms Janet, still a child herself, was left alone to care for her younger sister. This caused her to fall behind in her education. However, Ms Janet's life took a positive turn in 2013 when she met Michelle Stark, who welcomed her into Matanya's Hope. With their support, Janet was able to complete her education and become a teacher.

While in college, Ms. Janet began volunteering at one of Matanya's local day schools. She also began helping Michelle with the Matanya's Hope porridge program which feeds thousands of at risk and needy children every day of school. Eventually, Ms Janet became a teacher and guardian at one of the organization's safe homes for teens. In this role, she tirelessly supports at-risk and vulnerable girls, working hard to meet their basic and emotional needs. She is now happily married to a fellow Matanya's Hope alumnus and teacher. During our interview, Ms. Janet emphasized her personal motivation and left a powerful message: "Never lose hope."

I qualified for university education, but my family could not afford to send me. We prayed and God sent you Marie, as my destiny helper. You loved me, cared for me and provided my school fees. Every time Michelle came to Kenya, you sent her with gifts for me. You always included my mum, my little sister and my brother. You wrote me letters updating me about your son and Daughter and the grandchildren. I always loved when you sent me pictures. We were across oceans Marie, but I felt so connected to your soul. I still do. Because of you, Marie, I was able to finish my university education. I am now working and able to support myself and others. I have a little son. What I give him is a result of all you have given me, the greatest of which is hope and love. I thank God for you Marie.

Dear Mom Marie,

You saw potential in me when I could not even see it in myself. Your belief in my dreams, your encouragement and your generosity became the light that guided me out of the darkest moments of my life. I was a small village boy without shoes and dressed in torn clothes. I was unable to attend school due to poverty. Others saw a hopeless boy, but you saw potential in me.

You gave me Hope. Every accomplishment I have achieved since you sponsored me is part because of you. Your kindness opened doors I never thought I would walk through. Because of that, my life has transformed in ways I could never have imagined.
