

Wishing you and your family a wonderful summer filled with fun and happy memories made together!



hen we started our business five years ago, we got lots of tips and advice. One I recall (though I didn't really understand at the time) was to join a Rotary Club. I did a little research on local "clubs" to join and ended up finding a networking group I really liked. Checked that off the list (or so I thought) - however - unlike most business networking groups, Rotary is not designed for members to promote their businesses. Instead, it's a place where like-minded professionals and members of the community work together to help others in need.

What Exactly is a Rotary?

Rotary International (originally known as Rotary Club), was founded by five businessmen in Chicago in 1905. The name Rotary was chosen because originally the meeting location rotated among the offices of the various businessmen. Rotary is a global network of neighbors, friends, leaders, and problem-solvers who come together to make positive, meaningful change in communities at home and abroad.

The organization's mission is to benefit the community and the world through action, integrity, service, and fellowship. Together, through a collaboration of business, professional, and community leaders, members of Rotary create lasting change.

Rotary International describes itself as a humanitarian service organization that brings together business and professional leaders to provide community service, promote integrity, and advance goodwill, peace, and understanding in the world. The Rotary motto 'Service Above Self' is part of the ethos of the organization and can be seen in the way members interact with one another as well as the communities they serve.

Membership in Rotary is by invitation and based on various factors. There are over 46,000 member clubs worldwide, with 1.4 million individual members, known as Rotarians. Rotary International concentrates on seven areas: promoting peace, advancing health through disease prevention and treatment, improving the health of mothers and children, water and sanitation, education, economic development, and supporting the environment. The most notable current global project, PolioPlus, is contributing to the global eradication of polio.

Newtown Rotary has a more local focus, with members working on projects across Bucks County that support neighbors with service projects and fundraising, as well as programs like Pedals for Progress that help others around the globe. The chapter commemorates its 70th Anniversary in February of 2023 and plans to celebrate doing what they do best, ramping up efforts to help others.

Newtown Rotarians

Throughout 2021 and 2022, Kyle Davis served as the President of Newtown Rotary. The incoming President, Mick Petrucci, has a one-year term that begins on July 1, 2022, following an induction ceremony where they will officially "pass the gavel" from Mr. Davis to Mr. Petrucci. "It has been such an honor to serve as President of Newtown Rotary," says Kyle. "I'm proud of the accomplishments this fantastic group has had over the last several years, and am sure the organization will continue to thrive under Mick's leadership."

As an active Rotarian, Mick is excited about taking on an even broader role. As president, he will help set the tone and agenda for the board. "Presidents serve for a 1-year term unless they want to keep going," says Mick. "Our board consists of Paul Salvatore, Dr. Jerry Agasar, Allen Fidler, Ginny Kownurko, Rick Rogers, Danielle Wittig, Mark Craig, Charles Quattrone, and Marge Torongo. Our Newtown Rotary NextGen division," Mick shares, "Consists primarily of members under 35 years old. That group has been very active in Newtown and is led by Nathan Breece as President."

Newtown Rotary Service Projects

Christmas Dinner: For decades, Newtown Rotary has helped families that are struggling financially around the holidays. "We have been hosting Christmas dinner to assist several families living in motels on Route 1 and Route 13 with the help of chef Joseph Garvey," says Mick. "We are also a sponsor for the Christmas breakfast at the Washington Crossing Inn and we are a driving force for the Angel Tree Project during

the holiday season. All of these projects help families and individuals that are in need at a time when a small gesture like a warm meal and some gifts can mean everything to a family. We are very passionate about helping those in need during the holidays have a better season."

"We are proud to work with an international organization called Pedals for Progress," Kyle explains. "This project is led by Dr.Jerry Agasar, and we are in our 20th year collecting both bikes and sewing machines from the community. "We ship these to third world countries where we help change lives and give many a better chance of living easier lifestyles." A small thing like donating a bike can make a huge impact on a person in a developing country. "Most people who receive these bikes," says Mick, "It's their only means of transportation, so obviously extremely important to help them find employment, earn an income, attend school, and more."

The group hosts food drives at McCaffrey's Market in Newtown led by Sherry Donahue of Zebra Striped Whale benefiting the Wrightstown Food Cupboard. "We just hosted our largest event of the year called Hope on the Vine which was led by our NextGen group," says Kyle. "Many local non-profits will benefit. We also host an annual golf outing benefiting Pickering Manor in Newtown led by Paul Salvatore and Anthony Petsis."

What's Next for Newtown Rotary?

As the group looks to the future, Mick shares several goals. "As we embark on our 70-year anniversary in February," Mick tells us, "Our goals are to grow the organization. We'd also like to continue our community service projects, build membership, and enhance our social media presence. We will be strengthening our volunteer roles to include marketing and PR, Allocations Committee, and working towards setting up for another 70 years through our newly-formed Finance Committee. In addition, we have an endowment that has grown tremendously over the years, and we will be building upon this foundation with the help of Rick Rogers."

Auto Insurance Coverage Overview

Being in the insurance business, we get trade magazines all the time, and one recent article I read stated there are many consumers that buy auto insurance without a good understanding of what they are buying, so here are a few thoughts and examples to help our readers:

Liability Insurance: Split Limit vs. Flat Single Limit

Large bodily Injury lawsuits happen all the time, but what about property damage during an accident? If you total someone's new Ferrari or Bentley worth over \$200k, will a split limit liability limit leave you short?

Here are coverage examples:

- **Split Limit Coverage:** \$250,000 per person for bodily injury, \$500,000 for bodily Injury for the whole accident, and \$100,000 for Property Damage.
- Flat Single Limit Coverage: \$500,000 for both Bodily Injury and Property Damage.

Remember, the purpose of insurance is to cover you in case something goes wrong! While a split limit policy might save a few dollars in the insurance premium, as you can see from this example, flat single limit coverage is a better option in the scenario where there is an accident with an expensive vehicle. We recommend Flat Single Limit Coverage.

The Changing Landscape of Liability Claims

Recently, I attended a Liability course where about 60 insurance agents were in a room. The lawyer teaching the session started with a question. "How many agents here have had a customer with a loss over \$1 million, raise your hands." Every hand went up. He went up to \$2 million. Every hand went up again. Then to \$3 million, no hands were dropping. When he got to \$5 million, about half the class still had their hands up!

One of the agents asked him, "Is it true you will only be sued up to the limit of your coverage?" The Lawyer laughed, "No that has no truth. In fact, the jury is barred from knowing what the insurance coverage is because they don't want it to influence what they might award an injured party. They always make the award first and then see if there are enough insurance limits."

Bottom Line: Large claims are becoming commonplace; be sure you are properly insured.

Umbrella Policies

Always get a Personal Umbrella Policy in force to improve your liability coverage. Umbrella policies are designed to protect you and can add millions more liability coverage to your Auto and Homeowners coverage.





They are usually very affordable. What happens if you do not have enough coverage? If there isn't enough coverage in the policy, other forms of payment are considered — such as putting liens on your property or setting up payment plans to make up the uncovered amount. An Umbrella Policy helps ensure you do have enough coverage.

Basic First Party Benefits Coverage:

In Pennsylvania, we have a section on the Auto policy called Basic First Party Benefits. This option can provide wage loss/disability coverage, medical coverage, and life insurance coverage. You may buy these auto coverage items separately, or in a combination benefit that includes all options under one limit which may provide added flexibility for you and any passengers. Which option you choose is based on a variety of factors that your agent should review with you.

Here's why choosing the right coverage in this area matters. As an example, often in a disability claim, the source of the disability is an auto accident. People that drive a lot for their jobs like real estate agents, contractors, and other professionals (anyone with long commutes to work and especially those without workman's compensation coverage) need to have wage-loss protection in their auto insurance. This is part of what Basic First Party Benefits Coverage is designed to provide.

Uninsured and Underinsured Motorist Coverage

I read an article that stated in Lower Bucks County, about 40% of the drivers either have no auto insurance or the state minimum coverage (which is \$15,000 for bodily injury). If one of these drivers has a serious accident with you, and your injuries are life-changing, you may want to bring a suit against that person. This is where Uninsured and Underinsured Motorist comes in, as it allows you to collect from your own carrier on behalf of the driver that hit you. This is important coverage and can be a game-changer if you're seriously injured.


Comprehensive and Collision Deductibles

Having a higher deductible on your insurance can save you on your premiums. I prefer to go with \$1,000 deductibles on Comprehensive and Collision coverage if I can save money on a premium. That savings also helps me pay for a good Personal Umbrella policy. Although a \$1,000 deductible might sting if I get in an accident tomorrow, in a few years, I will have already saved the \$1000 in premiums because I chose a higher deductible.

If you are reading this and aren't completely sure what your auto insurance premiums include, it's a good idea to review them.

I'd be happy to look at your policy, point out any holes I see and provide a competitive quote to be sure you're getting the right coverage at a fair rate!

Summer Grilling: Huli Huli Grilled Split Chicken

Ingredients

4 garlic cloves, minced

1 cup 100% pineapple juice

1/2 cup ketchup

1/3 cup less sodium soy sauce

1/4 cup honey

2 tablespoons rice vinegar

2 tablespoons sriracha chili sauce

2 teaspoons grated fresh ginger

1 1/2 teaspoons toasted sesame oil

- Place chicken in large zip-top plastic bag; pour 1 1/4 cups garlic mixture over chicken. Seal bag, pressing out excess air; massage chicken in bag to coat. Refrigerate at least 1 or up to 4 hours
- Prepare outdoor grill for direct grilling over medium-high heat.
 Remove chicken from marinade; discard marinade. Place chicken on hot grill rack; cover and cook 40 minutes or until internal temperature reaches 165°, brushing with remaining 1 1/4 cups garlic mixture every 10 minutes and turning once.
- Serve chicken topped with cilantro, pineapple and/or green onions, if desired.

Keep Your Car Cool this Summer with Air Conditioner Maintenance

It's that time of the year again. In July, the temperatures will be sweltering and driving a car without good air conditioning is no fun!

You may think you could just stop by an auto parts store and get one of those cans with the hose attached and shoot some refrigerent into your AC system. This isn't such a good idea though. It may work in the short term, but cause more harm in the long term.

There are several reasons why in most cases you shouldn't just add refrigerent to a car on your own when the AC isn't working.

- The system requires not only the right type of refrigerent, but the right
 amount, specified by weight. Putting in the wrong type, or the wrong
 amount, can at the very least cause it to not work well. In some cases
 expensive damage can be caused to your compressor or other parts of
 the system. Guessing the amount to add is not a good idea.
- The system should be monitored while charging, using a set of pressure gauges, in order to make sure the AC is charged to the right level and operating properly.
- If refrigerent is low it means something may be wrong. It's not supposed to be low. AC is a closed system and if refrigerent is low

it means the system is not really closed and there may be a leak. Your mechanic can diagnose the leak using special dyed

refrigerent and repair leaks before they get worse.

- An empty or low system has had atmospheric air come in, air has water vapor in it, and that means moisture is in the system. This needs to be removed and dried with a vacuum pump.
- There is supposed to be a certain amount of lubricant in the system, the amount and type can vary. Your AC system will last longer if it is properly lubricated.
- Refrigerent can cause burns to skin and can hurt the environment if released into the air. Mechanics have special equipment to recover old refrigerent from your AC system without harming people or the environment.




