

## ROTARY INTERNATIONAL MATCHING GRANT #69256 PROVIDING CLEAN – SAFE DRINKING WATER

The Rotary Club of Chiang Mai North is working to ensure that a sustainable supply of fresh, clean water is available to the 1,200 students at Piang Luang School, Wiang Haen District, Chiang Mai.

Working in co-operation with Engineers Without Borders, and supported by a Matching Grant from Rotary International, the Chiang Mai North Rotarians have helped to guide this project from its inception.

The Rotary Club of Twinsburg, Ohio, USA is the International Partner Rotary Club for this humanitarian project. The Rotary Club of Nordonia Hills and the Rotary Club of Strongsville – all from Ohio – and Rotary Clubs from District 6460 in West Central Illinois, USA, also provided generous financial support for this Project.

Members of the Engineers Without Borders team, including Matthew Kashuk, P. Eng., and Dr. Andrew Rollins from Case Western Reserve University, have made 2 site visits. Recently, they were recognized for their significant contributions to this project by the Chiang Mai North Rotary Club. Pramote Eua-Amnuay, a member of the Chiang Mai North club, is the Chair of this Rotary International Matching Grant Project.







ROTARY PEACE FELLOWS studying at the Rotary Peace Center at Chulalongkorn University recently traveled to Chiang Mai and Mae Hong Son in Northern Thailand. They were on an 8 day field study to look at issues related to human trafficking and refugees. Before they graduate at the end of their three month course in September, the 17 fellows from 13 countries will also travel to Cambodia to investigate the post-conflict transformation. While in Chiang Mai, the fellows were hosted to a *khantok* dinner and group *ram wong* by the Chiang Mai Rotarians. All Rotary Peace Fellows receive full fellowships from The Rotary Foundation for their studies.
