Rotary provides \$20 million to help communities worldwide respond to COVID-19 Coronavirus

EVANSTON, Ill. (June 23, 2020) — Rotary members throughout the world are working safely and diligently to assess & provide for urgent community needs as they strive to respond and recover from the effects of COVID-19.



Fighting disease is one of Rotary's main causes, so members already support efforts to promote proper hand washing techniques, teach people other ways to stay healthy, and supply training and vital medical equipment to health care providers. Now they're **helping health authorities communicate lifesaving information** about COVID-19 and **donating protective gear and other supplies** to clinics and hospitals that are under strain because of the pandemic.

Here is a brief summary of recent indicators for Milwaukee area suburbs:



Cases	Yellow but starting to turn Green = totals can change dramatically by the day but are starting to trend down
Testing	Red to Yellow = although number of COVID-19 tests performed each day is below the desired 2,000 threshold, the percent of tests resulted as positive is below 10%.
Care	Green = no hospital in crisis care and less than 10% of hospitalized patients are COVID+.
PPE	Yellow = hospitals have 8-28 days of the personal protective equipment supply they need.
Tracing	Yellow = demonstrates the public health systems' ability to contact and identify those who have been exposed in a timely manner.

Milwaukee County's suburban municipalities are moving forward with the next phase of reopening, including guidelines to include slightly larger mass gatherings of at least 50 people, as well as increasing to 75% the capacity guideline for restaurants and bars. **"This is a phase we're probably going to be in for a long time,"** said Darren Rausch, director and health officer with the Greenfield Health Department. "It's probably going to carry us for the next several weeks or couple months, **as we continue to look at the data and try and suppress COVID-19 in our communities,**" he added.
