**New Focus:** The Rotary Foundation Trustees and Rotary International Board of Directors have both unanimously approved adding a new area of focus: **supporting the environment.** 



Past RI President Mark Maloney noted that during his travels around the world as a Rotary senior leader he encountered many Rotary members and Rotaractors who advocated for the environment to be an area of focus. "I believe strongly that our Rotary Foundation programs now have a valuable added dimension to our efforts," says, Maloney. "We are qualified to take this initiative because we are a global group of problem solvers with diversified talents."

Supporting the environment becomes Rotary's seventh area of focus, which are categories of service activities supported by global grants. It joins peacebuilding and conflict prevention; disease prevention and treatment; water, sanitation, and hygiene; maternal and child health; basic education and literacy; and community economic development. Grant applications for projects will be accepted beginning on 1 July 2021. More information about this new cause will be announced soon.
