

Since 1962, generations of young people have discovered the power of Service Above Self. Interact clubs bring together young people ages 12-18 to develop leadership skills while discovering the power of Service Above Self. A quick reminder about four ways to elevate youth voices who participate in our Interact clubs:

Work toward their goals, not yours. This is a club by and for young people — allow them to be the ones to shape it. Remember, Rotary members are to mentor young people, not manage them.

Include youths in your committees, task forces, and teams. Look for opportunities to include Interactors in
leadership roles in your club and district. Invite Interactors to your district conferences and training events.

Let them take the lead. It's by planning club meetings and service projects that Interactors gain lifelong skills in management, negotiation, and relationship building. So play the supporting role by volunteering at Interact events wherever they need help.
