Peace is more than the absence of violence - it's creating and sustaining societies that allow all people to flourish.



Rotary International and Bahçeşehir University (BAU) announced their partnership agreement to establish the Otto and Fran Walter Rotary Peace Center, offering a professional certificate program for peace and development professionals in the Middle East and North Africa (MENA) region. The center is located at the university's Future Campus outside of Istanbul, Turkey.

The new center will train regional peacebuilders through a one-year Rotary Peace Fellowship. With a strong focus on Positive Peace – as defined by attitudes, institutions and structures that create and sustain peaceful societies - students will engage in a comprehensive curriculum in peacebuilding and conflict resolution.

Jason Schaak has been in the fire service for two decades. In that time, he's seen the rise of the opioid epidemic. "It's a challenge. It's a challenge to be a provider and to continuously see this happen to a community and not have the tools or resources to combat it." Schaak said. New as of last year, he and his team have another resource. In addition to being able to administer Narcan, the department can now administer buprenorphine. "This is something provided to people that are experiencing opioid withdrawals," Schaak explained.

In responding to a 911 overdose call, Narcan is administered to stop the effects of the illicit substance. However, that also puts the patient into an immediate and painful withdrawal situation. To counter the negative withdrawal symptoms, Buprenorphine is administered in the form of a pill that dissolves in the mouth. After giving this first dose of buprenorphine, the West Allis Fire Department then works to create a long-term plan for the patients' recovery.
