An estimated 5.9 million children under the age of five die each year because of malnutrition, inadequate health care, and poor sanitation — all of which can be prevented. Rotary makes high-quality health care available to vulnerable mothers and children so they can live longer and grow stronger.

Prior Week: July 11th - Angela Vickio, Hank Aaron State Trail

Angela Vickio, Natural Resources Property Supervisor with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, was our guest speaker – providing information about the Hank Aaron State Trail.

Named in honor of baseball legend Hank Aaron, this local trail provides a continuous connection between American Family Field, home of the Milwaukee Brewers, and the Lake Michigan lakefront. This trail also links to famous Milwaukee landmarks such as the Ward Theatre on the grounds of the Historic Soldiers Home, the Wisconsin State Fair Park and the Pettit National Ice Center. The development of the Hank Aaron State Trail has contributed to the restoration,

protection and enhancement of the Menomonee River Valley – helping restore fish and wildlife habitat and with the rehabilitation of urban waterways.

The Hank Aaron State Trail is 12 miles (including some on-street segments), with 10 miles of paved asphalt and 2 miles of limestone. This trail is great for bicyclists, walkers, joggers and in-line skaters and is accessible for people with disabilities.

Our West Allis Rotary team does not yet meet the 8 participant minimum for the <u>24th Annual Hank</u> <u>Aaron State Trail Run/Walk</u> on August 10th! However, there is still time to sign up.
