Richard Muihead shared his experiences of deciding to seed their family farmland into prairie grass, instead of allowing it to be developed. The Muirhead family migrated to Northern IL from Scotland in the 1800s. The 757-acre Muirhead Springs Forest Preserve, situated in central Kane County, was originally full of prairie flowers and wetlands before being converted to farmland for 140+ years. Rotary's Work to End Human Trafficking

Did you know that nearly 50 million people worldwide are victims of human trafficking? It's a hidden crisis—one that Rotary is working to stop. Rotary clubs worldwide are fighting human trafficking by:

- Raising awareness and educating communities on how to recognize and report trafficking.
- Supporting survivors with housing, counseling, and job training.
- Partnering with law enforcement and advocacy groups to strengthen anti-trafficking efforts.

One example is Rotary's partnership with the Global Freedom Network, which is working to end modern slavery through policy change and survivor support programs. In the U.S., clubs in places like Houston and Atlanta—both major trafficking hubs—have launched initiatives to protect at-risk youth, train hotel staff to spot trafficking, and provide direct aid to victims. Rotary's mission is service above self, and that means standing up for the most vulnerable. Ending human trafficking is a big challenge, but together, we can make a difference.
