Last Week: Apr 24th - Nick Sgarlata, Bridge to Brighter - aging out of Foster Care

Nick Sgarlata, Executive Director/President of Bridge to Brighter, shared how his non-profit organization works with young men who have aged out of foster care in Milwaukee County. Their mission is guided by faith and strives to meet the physical and emotional needs of youth impacted by foster care. Bridge to Brighter's efforts are anchored in providing critical, safe and stable housing. They then provide support and mentoring through resources and programming that assist with employment and job training, building healthy relationships, healing from trauma, and moving forward towards sustained independence.

One out of 184 children in the US are in foster care (over 400,000), with an average stay of 22 months. 20% of foster youth will become homeless the day they age out. 50% of children in foster care will never graduate high school or obtain a GED. Nick and the team at Bridge to Brighter is looking to help change the outcomes. Nick and his wife are currently fostering two boys, Raphael (7) and Joseph (5). https://bridgetobrighter.org/
