Reasons to love Rotary right now .... Reason #68: **Rotary Honors Samuel Owori**

A **Global Grant** has been developed to recognize the work and life of Samuel Owori, Rotary International President Elect (Deceased) 2018-19. This project is designed to provide communities in the Tororo District in Eastern Region of Uganda with **clean water and improves sanitation and health** by providing: 10 new boreholes for community health facilities; 10 rainwater harvesting tanks and 10 school sanitation facilities.



The Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) skills needed—such as hand washing and hygiene training—will support Maternal and Newborn Children at health facilities. **The funding goal is \$167,780.**



The Global Grant application has been written in partnership with the Ugandan Rotary team. Help from clubs and districts is needed and appreciated.

Jessica Gonzalez, Executive Director of **Crimson Charities**, is focused on the mission of transforming communities through God's compassion by offering services that empower individuals and strengthen families.



Crimson Charities offers **after school programs** – partnering with volunteers and offering afterschool programming for students needing homework support and a safe environment for students and their families to get involved. Tutors are volunteers that focus in areas that students request.

Kids Fest is a 3-day summer camp program that provides an **opportunity for children 1st through 6th grade** to enjoy time with their peers while engaging in activities and building relationships and character together.

The Crimson Community Center Opened May 2017 and is located at 6125 W. National Avenue in West Allis. **For adults**, the community center provides a support group for domestic violence victims, a food pantry, home ownership education classes and job coaching.

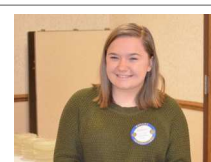

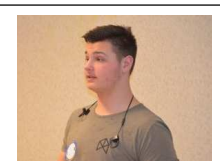
