Background Information:

Time frames can vary from several days to several weeks. The student generally doesn't have to attend the host country school, however. Students will be able to book any desired tours of specific regions during the trip. Common exchanges include homestays, tours, family-to-family, and international youth camps.

Eligibility:

Students must be above-average students who demonstrate leadership skills within their community and should be flexible and willing to try new things that will advance their cultural awareness. Long-Term Exchange

Background Information
