
Rotarians are People of Action

Rotary has a wide reach

There are Rotary Clubs in 169 Countries

We're organized into 532 Rotary Districts

Approximately 33,000 Clubs are chartered

There are ~1.2M members of Rotary in the world

We have ~4,000 Rotarians in our District 5170

We have over 200 members in the Livermore Clubs

Our club has 40 Livermore Valley Rotarians







Rotary Club of Chicago, Illinois formed on February 23, 1905 by Paul Harris

"Rotary" was derived from rotating meetings among member's offices

It quickly spread to West Coast – San Francisco and then Oakland – Number 3

The Rotary Foundation was established in 1928





The Four Way Test was adopted by Rotary in 1943

(created in 1932 by Rotarian Herbert Taylor)

There are 2 non-profit foundations that amplify the impact of your generosity

The Rotary International Foundation supports matching grants, PolioPlus, Disaster Relief, Group Study Exchange, Ambassadorial Scholarships, Grants for University Teachers...

"Every Rotarian, Every Year" = \$25

To become a "Sustainer" = \$100/year

A "Double-Sustainer" = \$200/year

An initial \$1000 = Paul Harris Fellowship with multiple Paul Harris recognition for each subsequent \$1000 donation





There are 2 non-profit foundations that amplify the impact of your generosity

The Rotarian Foundation of Livermore is operated by a Board of Directors comprised of members of the two Rotary Clubs in Livermore

Currently has a \$1M+ corpus built on the fundraising efforts of both clubs since 1985

The returns on the invested corpus fund youth-oriented projects in Livermore through an annual grant process

The RFL also manages community projects on behalf of the clubs through its 501c.3 status



The Rotarian Foundation of Livermore directly impacts our community



RFL raised the funds and constructed the Carnegie Park Bandstand

The Foundation sponsors an annual grant program averaging \$50,000 disbursement

An annual holiday party for children from Head Start is hosted by the RFL

The Bill Geyer Scholarship for a Livermore graduating high school senior is sponsored through the RFL
