MASSILLON BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING MINUTES FEBRUARY 7, 2023

The Board of Directors met on February 7, 2023 at Kozmo's Grille. The following members were present: Keith Nutter, Jim Stanford, Dan Swartz, Tom Jingo, Dr. Bill Leffler, Chad Hartman, Richard Regula, Angela Cooper, Kathy Shultz, Matt Hull, and Carolyn Worthen.

The minutes of the January 3, 2023 Board meeting were presented for approval. Upon a motion by Mr. Nutter and a second by Mr. Regula, the minutes were approved, as presented.

SECRETARY'S REPORT:

Mr. Jingo presented a request for Exempt membership status from Marshall Weinberg. Mr. Weinberg qualifies for Exempt status. Upon a motion by Mr. Nutter and a second by Mr. Regula, the Board approved Mr. Weinberg's request.

The Board received a membership application from Captain Brennen Hinzman, of the Massillon Salvation Army. Captain Hinzman has participated in the club's new member orientation program. Upon a motion by Dr. Leffler and a second by Mr. Regula, the Board approved Captain Hinzmen's application for presentation to the club membership. The weekly percentage of attendance by active members for the January 2023 club meetings was 42%.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Copies of the club's financial report for the period ending December 31, 2022 ware distributed. The report showed Current Assets at \$60,324.66 and Accounts Receivable at \$1,266.00, for Total Assets of \$61,689.66. Total Liabilities stood at \$7,506.00 and Total Equity at \$54,183.66, for Total Liabilities & Equity of \$61,689.66. The Board discussed some aspects of the report and upon a motion by Mr. Nutter and a second by Mr. Stanford, the Board accepted the December 31, 2022 Financial Report.

CLUB SERVICE:

Mr. Hartman reported that our club's participation in the 2023 IMPACT Massillon project has been confirmed. We will be responsible for work at one house. Recently, there has been an insufficient number volunteers for the Meals-on-Wheels program. There will be an effort to more actively promote this project at upcoming club meetings. The schedule for the spring clean-up at Lincoln Park is on hold until the City completes the work that is currently on-going at the park. Gift bags for students participating in this year's RYLA Conference will be distributed. Mr. Hartman suggested that the club plant a tree at the pocket park in memory of Jeff Stoll's late son. The Board agreed that we should do this.

MEMBERSHIP:

Mrs. Shultz will follow-up with the Director for Spring Hill regarding Rotary membership.

MASSILLON ROTARY FOUNDATION:

The Foundation Board has approved and submitted a \$50,000 grant for the Pump House Project. There is some concern that the City of Massillon may not proceed with that project.

PROGRAMS:

The schedule of club meeting programs for February has been finalized. Mr. Stanford asked for program suggestions for some of the vacant dates in the upcoming months. Possible sites for the club's March Social were discussed.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

President Swartz expressed a desire to have a representative from the Paul Brown Scholarship Committee come to a Board meeting to update the Board on the status of that scholarship fund.

Alex Coon has been asked to head up the Paul David Humanitarian Award Project. The Board discussed what role our club should take in beautification of Massillon efforts. It was the consensus of the Board that our annual Operation Warm Project should be expanded to other parts of our service area.

We have been asked to help sponsor the Hospitality Room for this year's PETS Conference, in the amount of \$220. Upon a motion by Dr. Leffler and a second by Mr. Nutter, the Board approved this request.

The Board discussed finding a new meeting site for our Board meetings. A few possible sites were identified. There was some support expressed for remaining at our current location.

NEXT MEETING:

The next regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Directors is Tuesday, March 7th, at 11:30am, at Kozmo's Grille.

ADJOURNMENT:

Upon a motion by Mr. Hartman and a second by Mr. Hull, the meeting was adjourned at 12:50pm.

The letters serve as a barometer for us as to whether or not the students "got" the messages which were taught. We hope that you will agree that the students did indeed learn from the RYLA experience.




