ROTARY CLUB OF MASSILLON
BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING MINUTES
JUNE 4, 2019

The Board of Directors met at Kozmo's Grille on Tuesday, June 4, 2019. The following members were present: Dick Leffler, Tom Jingo, Wendy Blosser, Dr. Bill Leffler, Sherie Brown, Keith Nutter, Joe Logan, Richard Regula, Jim Stanford, Matt Hull, and Linda Litman.

In the absence of President Hartman, President-Elect Keith Nutter called the meeting to order. The minutes of the May 7, 2019 Board meeting were presented for approval. Upon a motion by Dr. Leffler and a second by Mr. Hull, the minutes were approved, as presented.

SECRETARY'S REPORT:

Mr. Jingo reported that the average percentage of attendance by active members for the five club meetings in May was 47%.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Mr. Leffler circulated a copy of the Accounts Aging report and commented that the May report was very similar to the April report and that he was following up with two members who are of concern.

He presented the club's nine-month financial report for the period ending March 31, 2019. The report showed total income of \$28,636.80 for that period, with total expenses for the same period of \$20,154.52, for a net income of \$8,482.28. At the end of that period the report showed Cash on Hand of \$100, with Cash in Bank of \$62,442.50, for a total in checking and savings of \$62,542.50.

The preliminary report for our major fund-raiser shows a net income of about \$15,000. There may be a few additional expenses that could slightly reduce that total.

Upon a motion by Mr. Jingo and a second by Mr. Logan, the Board accepted the Treasurer's Report.

CLUB SERVICE:

Our IMPACT Massillon project went well, with 6 Rotarians and 6 other volunteers on our team.

MEMBERSHIP:

Scott Schnabel will be inducted into the club of June 6th. His classification is Real Estate.

MASSILLON ROTARY FOUNDATION:

The Foundation will sponsor another Health Fair at the Mercy Health Center of Massillon on June 22nd. There will also be free mammograms offered on June 18th at the same site. Volunteers are needed on June 22nd date.

The Foundation Board will award its nursing scholarships at the club's Installation Dinner in late June.

In July, new club president, Keith Nutter, will join the Foundation Board of Directors along with the new chairperson of the Club Service Committee.

INTERNATIONAL:

Dr. Leffler reported that the club will be contributing \$1,000 to Rotary International's Shelter Box Project.

PROGRAMS:

The schedule for club meeting programs is pretty well filled through August. The club's Annual Installation Dinner for Officers and Directors is scheduled for June 27th. There will be no noon club meeting that day. Also, there will not be a club meeting scheduled for July 4th. The Hall of Fame Queen's Court has been scheduled for one meeting, and we will make our annual pre-season visit to Paul Brown Stadium in August.

OLD BUSINESS:

We will be updating our club membership application to reflect Corporate Membership plan.

Mrs. Litman inquired if there are funds available for a major project and was advised that such funds are available. She advised the Board that the City is still planning to move forward with plans to construct a new pavilion at the West Side Park. The City would appreciate receiving financial support from organizations like Rotary for this project.

The City also plans to install a new structure at the Triangle Park at the exit from Route 21. That structure will reflect three important phases of the development of Massillon. If we would be willing to be a sponsor of that project, we would be entitled to install a Rotary plaque at the site. When our Rotary plaque was destroyed by an auto accident at that

site over a year ago, we had been advised that the City's insurance would take care of replacing our plaque.

NEW BUSINESS:

A question was raised as to how much those who did not paint at the May Club Social should be charged.

It was suggested that we should see if we could find an appropriate way to be included in the Massillon Museum's Massillon Pro Football Celebration.

The question was raised as to the status of the Paul David Humanitarian Award. There are funds available, but we need someone to provide leadership for this project.

The Board will seek to find answers to the questions posed above.

NEXT MEETING:

The next regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Directors is Tuesday, July 2nd, at 11:30am, at Kozmo's Grille.

ADJOURNMENT:

Upon a motion by Mr. Hull and a second by Mr. Logan, the meeting was adjourned at 12:50pm.
