**ROTARY CLUB OF MASSILLON
BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING MINUTES
October 6, 2020**

The Board of Directors met at Kozmo's Grille on Tuesday, September 1, 2020. The following members were present: Bill Leffler, Matt Hull, Richard Regula, Todd Loxley, Chad Hartman, Daniel Swartz, Richard Leffler, Kathy Schultz and Keith Nutter.

The first matter of business was to approve the minutes of the September 1, 2020 meeting. Upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried the minutes of the September 1, 2020 meeting were approved.

SECRETARY'S REPORT:

Mr. Hull presented to the Board the proposal to accept, with regret, the resignation of Dr. Anthony Perry as a member of the Club effective August 31, 2020. Upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried the Board voted to accept Dr. Perry's resignation effective August 31, 2020. Mr. Hull then presented to the Board the proposal to extend a leave of absence to Jim Stanford until January 12, 2021, or until such earlier time as he is able to return following surgery. Upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried the Board voted to extend such leave of absence to Jim Stanford.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Mr. Leffler led a discussion reviewing the proposed Club operating budget for 2020-2021, including expected Club revenues and expenses. The Board engaged in a discussion relating to the initiation and badge fees for new members as well as the quarterly dues for members. Upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried the Board voted to approve the initiation and badge fees for new members in the same amount as the prior year. Further, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried the Board voted to approve the dues for members in the same amount as the prior year. Finally, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried the Board voted to approve the overall operating budget for the Club for 2020-2021.

CLUB SERVICE:

Mr. Hartman introduced a proposal for a service project relating to providing water bottles to local schools to pass out to their students. The genesis of this project relates to the fact that water fountains have been turned off in the schools due to the current pandemic. It was proposed that the Club would provide Rotary branded water bottles to the schools so that the students could have water with them during the school day. Mr. Nutter stated that Aqua Ohio will purchase the water bottles for the Club's use.

Mr. Hull noted that the Club would need a new member to help coordinate students for the RYLA program. Mr. Hull stated he would reach out to Jay Bomze to see if he would be willing to do this given he already coordinates students of the month with the schools.

Mr. Hull also discussed the students of the month program. He noted he would follow up with Mr. Bomze to see if the schools were planning on sending students to Club meetings to be recognized in light of the pandemic. Mr. Hull also noted he would reach out to Fairless to see if they would like to participate in the students of the month program. The Board had a brief discussion on potential gifts from the Club for the students of the month.

MEMBERSHIP

Mrs. Shultz stated that Jeff Brest had reached out to her and was interested in having Ohio Drilling Company join the Club as a corporate member. Mrs. Shultz stated that she was working to set up a time to go through the orientation materials with Mr. Brest.

MASSILLON ROTARY FOUNDATION:

No report.

INTERNATIONAL:

Mr. Leffler reported that the Club sent a check for \$1,000 to the Shelter Box program. The Board also discussed having a representative from the project to speak virtually at one of the Club's upcoming meetings.

PROGRAMS:

Mr. Hartman gave an update on the upcoming programs. It was also presented for discussion whether the annual fundraiser, currently pushed back to February, would likely go forward. Mr. Hartman also reminded the Board of the fifth Thursday social on October 29th which is to be held at the Dragon Fly Winery.

Mr. Hull discussed holding a regular meeting at Buffalo Wild Wings in Massillon so that the Canton Rotary Club president can make good on his bet stemming from the McKinley-Massillon game to eat the hottest wings on the menu. Mr. Hull also mentioned having Dave Jingo come to this meeting to talk about his documentary "Timeless Rivals."

OLD BUSINESS:

The Board discussed the Paul Brown Scholarship and the scholarship committee. Mr. Hull informed the Board that Alex Coon from the Massillon Museum and Paul Salvino from Massillon City Schools said they would be on the scholarship committee. Mr. Hull noted that Vince Pedro was in the process of setting up a meeting of the scholarship committee and had reached out to Mike Brown to see if he would still be willing to be a keynote speaker at an upcoming scholarship presentation.

The Board briefly discussed the social Dan McMasters had agreed to host and the money the Club gave to Mr. McMasters for the social. Mr. Hull stated he would follow up with Mr. McMasters to see if he would like to reschedule the social.

Mr. Hull gave the Board a brief update on the potential Tuscarawas River clean-up project. Phil Elum and Jon Dietz were working to contact the Muskingum Watershed District and the Army Corps of Engineers with respect to the project.

NEXT MEETING:

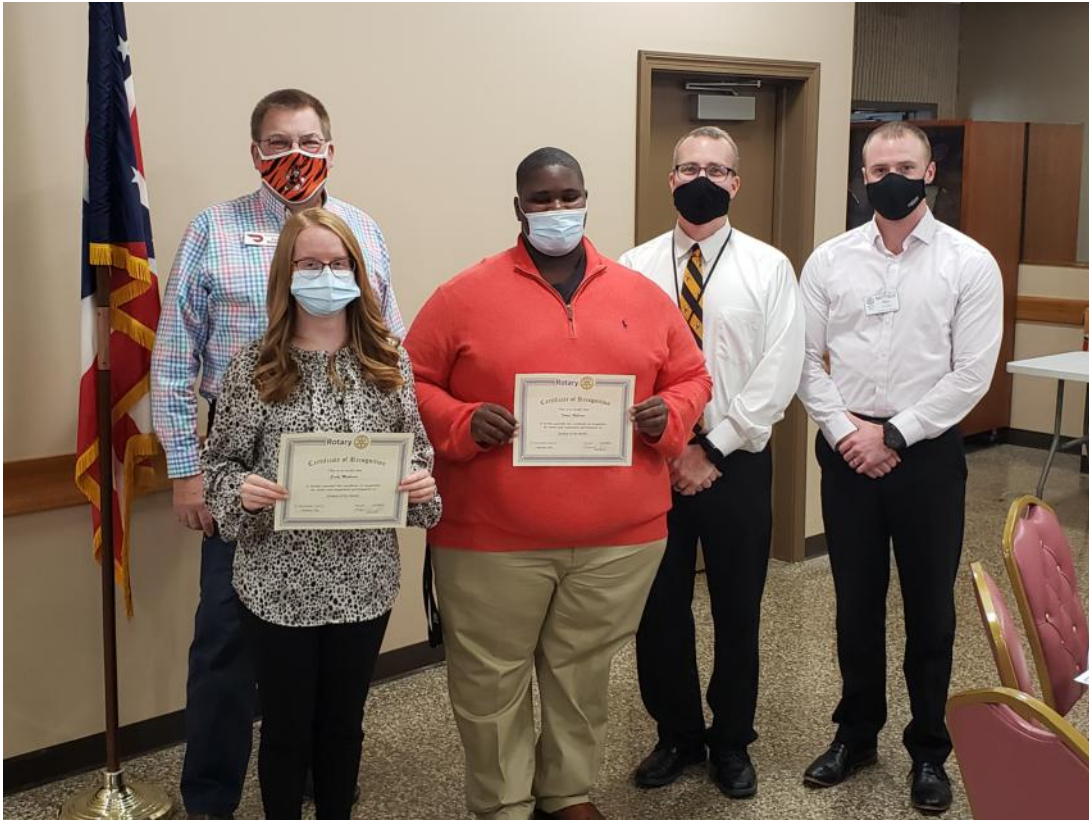
The next regularly scheduled meeting on the Board of Directors is Tuesday, November 3rd, at 11:30am, at Kozmo's Grille.
