ROTARY CLUB OF MASSILLON BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING MINUTES OCTOBER 4, 2022

The Board of Directors met at Kozmo's Grille on Tuesday, October 4, 2022. The following members were present: Dan Swartz, Tom Jingo, Jim Stanford, Jeff Brest, Keith Nutter, Dick Leffler, Angela Cooper, Dr. Bill Leffler, Chad Hartman, and Todd Loxley.

The minutes of the September 6, 2022 were presented for approval. Upon a motion by Mr. Nutter and a second by Mr. Loxley, the minutes were approved, as presented.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Mr. Leffler circulated a copy of the latest Accounts Aging Report and advised the Board that, with just a couple of exceptions, there were currently no real concerns.

He reported that we have been advised by Santangelo Catering that our luncheon meal cost will be raised from \$10 to \$11 per person. With the gratuity that we provide, our cost will \$13 per person. Therefore, members will be billed \$13 per meal and those paying at the door will be charged \$14.

A concern was raised regarding those who only order a salad for lunch. The salad is not large enough to require the full meal priced. We will address this issue with the caterer.

CLUB SERVICE:

The Hartman family recently undertook the clean-up and upgrading of a small park in Massillon as a Rotary project.

Our Meals on Wheels project has only one date in December that is currently without a volunteer.

MEMBERSHIP:

The individual membership application for Mitchell Graham was presented for approval. Mr. Graham is the owner of Jdog Junk Removal. Upon a motion by Mr. Loxley and a second by Mr. Nutter, the Board voted to send Mr. Graham's membership application notice to the club membership.

Mrs. Shultz is setting up a membership orientation for Rayetta Kanters.

MASSILLON ROTARY FOUNDATION:




