












# New Member Alexandra Coon

Alexandra Nicholis Coon, executive director for the Massillon Museum, holds a BA in art history from Kent State University, an MA in art history through the joint program at the Cleveland Museum of Art and Case Western Reserve University, and a collections care certificate from the Campbell Center for Historic Preservation Studies. She has been with the Massillon Museum since 2001 and served as its curator from 2003 to 2010. Nicholis Coon is past president of the Ohio Museums Association; board chair for Visit Canton; a board member of the Cleveland Print Room, Massillon WestStark Chamber Foundation, Aultman Health Foundation, and Soroptimist International of Canton/Stark County; and a member of the City of Massillon's Community Improvement Corporation. Museum Advocacy is near and dear to her heart; she has joined museum colleagues nationwide on Capitol Hill for seven years now as part of the American Alliance of Museums Advocacy Day, and communicates regularly with elected officials at the state and local levels.

Her love of photography led her to curate *Darkrooms in a Digital Age* (2007) and *Between Two Worlds: The Photography of Nell Dorr* (2010) for the Massillon Museum, among numerous other exhibitions. Coon has curated two exhibitions for the Ohio Arts Council's Riffe Gallery in Columbus as well. While serving as an instructor of art history and museum studies courses at Walsh University, she assisted with establishment of the university's museum studies undergraduate program in 2007. She enjoys digital photography and earned honorable mention in the Professional Women Photographer's 37th International Women's Call for Entry (2012), and has been exhibited in several Northeast Ohio shows. From 2018-2010, she led a renovation effort of the Massillon Museum's collections storage facility, upgrading it to a state-of-the-art, award-winning preservation space, and most recently oversaw the Museum's \$6 million dollar expansion to increase its capacity to serve the community by 18,000 square feet. In 2011, she was recognized with the YStark! "Twenty Under 40" award, was a 2012 inductee to the Canton YWCA Women's Hall of Fame, and in 2020 was honored with the DeHoff Emerging Philanthropist Award. She is a member of the Akron Chapter DAR, and resides in North Canton with her husband and twin daughters.


