ROTARY CLUB OF MASSILLON
BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING MINUTES

APRIL 2, 2019

The Board of Directors met at Kozmo's Grille on Tuesday, April 2, 2019. The following members were present: Barb Schumacher, Tom Jingo, Linda Litman, Sherie Brown, Chad Hartman, Jim Stanford, John Shultz, Keith Nutter, Kim Edwards, Joe Logan, Michelle Hartman, and Matt Hull.

President Hartman called the meeting to order. The minutes of the March 5, 2019 meeting were presented for approval. Several minor corrections were recommended. Upon a motion by Ms. Schumacher and a second by Mrs. Litman, the corrected minutes were approved.

SECRETARY'S RERPORT:

Mr. Jingo informed the Board that Mrs. Hartman will be attending the Rotary International Convention in Hamburg, Germany and suggested that she be formally named as the club's official delegate to the Convention. Upon a motion by Mrs. Brown and a second by Mr. Nutter, the Board designated Mrs. Hartman as our delegate to the 2019 Convention.

Mr. Jingo advised the Board that our new liability insurance policy, which will become active on July 1, 2019, will be more restrictive in terms of coverage in certain areas than the expiring policy. The new policy will not cover the following designated high risk/exposure areas:

- Construction projects with materials valued over \$25,000.
- Ownership or operation of trains.
- Aircraft, including helicopters, drones, and hot air balloons.
- Ambulance service.
- Buildings or land donated to club/district foundations.
- Camps (other than weekend camps) – camp facilities that are owned and operated by the club.
- Non-Rotary businesses that are operated out of a club facility/ongoing operations.
- Separate legal entities other than a club, district, club foundation or district foundation.
- Events with a total of 25,000 attendees.

The percentage of attendance by active members for the four club meetings in March was 47%.

CLUB SERVICE:

Mr. Hartman reported that the Club Service Committee had authorized a \$100 contribution to the Salvation Army, \$200 each for two club members to support their participation in Mercy Medical Center's Wine, Women and Shoes fundraiser. The club's assistance with the Meals-on Wheels Program is on-going. The Seesan Memorial Park clean-up project is scheduled for April 27th, and the IMPACT Massillon project will be June 1st. The City of Massillon is moving forward with plans for the Park Pavilion Project, and will schedule a meeting for all interested parties. The Fiber Corr Company owns a property near the park and may be interested in donating it to the City.

MEMBERSHIP:

Mr. Schultz reported that a local realtor, Scott Schnabel, has expressed interest in joining and has attended a recent meeting. It was suggested that we contact a recent speaker, Scott Munteen.

PROGRAMS:

Mr. Nutter reported that plans for our May fundraiser are moving along quite well. We will have more sponsors than in the past, and there has been a very good response to the request for Silent Auction items.

OLD BUSINESS:

Open House Meeting: President Hartman attended a recent Open House meeting conducted by the Plain Township Rotary and got some helpful ideas on how to organize such an event. A list of good prospects to invite is extremely important.

Replacement Signs: Jay Bomze is putting together an inventory of the signs that will need to be replaced.

District Conference: Reservations are running below expectations and all clubs are being urged to send representation to that event, scheduled for April 12-13 in Columbus.

Corporate Membership: The Board discussed the need to move forward with developing a structure for our club's Corporate Membership category. The following action steps were taken:

* Upon a motion by Mr. Nutter and a second by Mr. Hull, the Board approved the creation of Corporate Membership as a category of membership. To qualify for Corporate membership an organization shall have attained the status of a legal entity.

* Upon a motion by Mr. Logan and a second by Mrs. Litman, the Board stipulated that a Corporate member shall designate a Primary member and no more than two (2) Alternate Members. The Primary Member shall have all the rights and responsibilities of membership as defined in the Club's Constitution and By-Laws. Alternate Members shall have no voting rights.

* Upon a motion by, Mr. Nutter and a second by Mrs. Litman, the Board established the quarterly dues for a Corporate Membership at \$65. The Board of Directors reserves the right to change Corporate Member dues at any time that circumstances require. Membership dues shall be paid by the organization.

* Upon a motion by Mrs. Brown and a second by Ms. Schumacher, the Board established that Primary Corporate members shall be charged the same amount for meals as Individual members. Alternate Corporate Members shall pay the at-the-door meal price.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mr. Nutter urged the Board to consider providing some reimbursement for convention expenses incurred by our Rotary International Convention delegate, Mrs. Hartman. Upon a motion by Mrs. Litman and a second by Mr. Logan, the Board authorized the reimbursement of convention expenses, not exceed the budgeted amount approved for that event. The date for our annual Club Auction is June 20th. It was suggested that funds raised at that event be earmarked for Operation Warm.

NEXT MEETING:

The next regularly scheduled meeting of the Board is Tuesday May, 7th, at 11:30am, at Kozmo's Grille.

ADJOURNMENT:

Upon a motion by Mr. Nutter and a second by Mrs. Litman, the meeting was adjourned at 1:05pm.
