ROTARY CLUB OF MASSILLON BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING MINUTES JANUARY 3, 2023

The Board of Directors met on January 3, 2023 at Kozmo's Grille. The following members were present: Keith Nutter, Tom Jingo, Dan Swartz, Richard Regula, Jeff Brest, Angela Cooper, Kathy Shultz, Dr. Bill Leffler, Dick Leffler, Todd Loxley, and Matt Hull. The minutes of the December 2022 Board meeting were presented for approval. Upon a motion by Dr. Leffler and a second by Mr. Regula, the minutes were approved, as presented.

SECRETARY'S REPORT:

The weekly percentage of attendance by active members for the three meetings in December was 43%. The club currently has 45 members on the roster.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

The latest Accounts Aging Report had just a few accounts listed, of which several were overpaid. Mr. Leffler indicated that there was only one account that deserved additional attention.

CLUB SERVICE:

Mr. Hartman was not in attendance but had forwarded his report to President Swartz. The second day of the Salvation Army Bell Ringing project was cancelled due to inclement weather. Emails will be sent to club members regarding volunteers for upcoming Meals-On-Wheels dates. Mr. Hartman noted that he plans to enroll the club in the 2023 IMPACT Massillon project unless the Board declines to participate. There were no objections from the Board regarding our participation. The Massillon Museum has requested a contribution of for the 2023 Big Read Program. A motion was made by Mr. Nutter and seconded by Mr. Hull to contribute \$1,000 to this program. Mr. Leffler pointed out that a contribution of \$1,000 for the Big Read Program has already been approved in our 2023-24 operating budget, therefore, no action by the Board was required. In response, Mr. Nutter and Mr. Hull withdrew their motions.

MEMBERSHIP:

Mrs. Shultz reported that she will be scheduling a new member orientation meeting with Salvation Army Captain Hinzman.

MASSILLON ROTARY FOUNDATION:

The Foundation Board has changed its schedule of quarterly meetings to coincide with the availability of quarterly financial reports. Its next meeting will be January 12th.

PROGRAMS UPDATE:

Programs for all the four January club meeting dates have been filled.

OTHER ITEMS:

Mr. Leffler reported that club member donations to the 2022 Operation Warm fund totaled \$2,850, of which, \$2,180 was requested for last year's purchase of coats. The remaining balance will be carried over for 2023.

It was noted that Mr. and Mrs. Hartman, using our Facebook site, tested to see if there might be a sufficient number of host families in our area to provide for an Exchange Student.

The Board was reminded that we should conduct an election for the President-Elect sometime soon.

The next meeting of the Board of Directors is Tuesday, February 7th, at 11:30am, at a site to be determined.

ADJOURNMENT:

Upon a motion by Mr. Hull and a second by Mrs. Shultz, the meeting was adjourned at 12:50pm.




