FEBRUARY 1, 2022**

The Board of Directors met at Kozmo's Grille on Tuesday, February 1, 2022. The following members were present: Carolyn Worthen, Tom Jingo, Joe Logan, Todd Loxley, Angela Cooper, Keith Nutter, Dr. Bill Leffler, Matt Hull, Kathy Shultz, and Dan Swartz.

In the absence of President Hartman, Mr. Hull served as meeting chairman. The minutes of the January 4, 2022 Board meeting were presented for approval. Upon a motion by Mrs. Cooper and a second by Mr. Logan, the minutes were approved, as presented.

SECRETARY'S REPORT:

Mr. Jingo advised the Board that David Lundquist has submitted his notice of resignation, due to health concerns. Upon a motion by Mr. Jingo and a second by Mr. Nutter, the Board accepted the resignation of Mr. Lundquist, with regret. Upon a motion by Mr. Nutter and a second by Mr. Jingo, the Board voted to make Mr. Lundquist's resignation retroactive to December 31, 2021.

The average weekly meeting percentage of active members in January 2022 was 44%.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Mr. Hull reported that he had received a check for \$500 from District 6650 for a grant request for the United Way Community Rent Project. There is some concern about the check, since it has been in the mail for several months and may no longer be accepted by the bank.

CLUB SERVICE:

The RYLA Conference for 2022 has been cancelled.

We have been notified that the delegate dues for this year's Buckeye Girls State Conference have been increased by \$50 per delegate.

The Boys and Girls Club of Massillon is interested in developing a partnership with the Keystone Club and the Rotary Interact Club. Because of a contract arrangement, the name Keystone Club must remain as part of any partnership.

Mr. Nutter will represent the club at the February 3rd planning meeting for the June 4th IMPACT Massillon project.

MEMBERSHIP:

Mrs. Shultz is working with the owner of Advanced Roofing to set up a Corporate Membership with that company. She is also following up with two other prospective members.

MASSILLON ROTARY FOUNDATION:

Mr. Logan advised the Board that the Foundation's Board of Directors next meeting will be in March.

PROGRAMS:

The Board discussed the threat of severe weather forecast for our next meeting date (Feb. 3rd). Upon a motion by Mr. Nutter and a second by Mr. Logan, the Board voted to cancel the February 3rd meeting, Mr. Jingo will send a cancellation notice to the membership and Mr. Swartz will notify the speaker, the church, and the caterer.

Mr. Swartz reported that he has several programs lined up for the coming meetings.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

Several Board members shared their experiences in contacting club members who had not been recently attending club meetings.

Board members were encouraged to invite a guest to the next club social in March.

Mr. Hull volunteered to contact the Perry Rotary Club regarding the possibility of joining together for a meeting or activity.

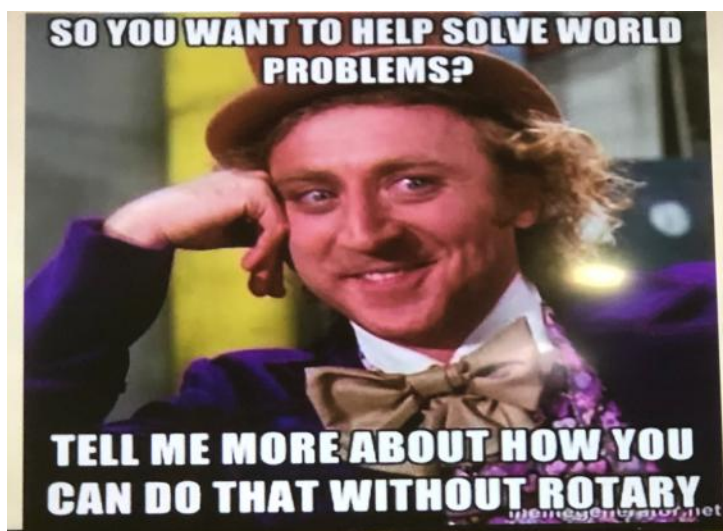
NEXT MEETING:
