ROTARY CLUB OF MASSILLON BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING MINUTES AUGUST 3, 2021

The minutes of the July 6, 2021 Board meeting were presented for approval. Upon a motion by Mr. Logan and a second by Mr. Hull, the minutes were approved, as corrected.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Mr. Leffler presented the proposed budget for 2021-2022. Proposed were total revenues of \$22,050 and total expenditures of \$30,371, leaving a projected deficit of \$8,3231. The deficit will be offset by our reserves and is due primarily to the losses of revenue created by the pandemic. Upon a motion by Mr. Hull and a second by Mrs. Hartman, the Board approved annual individual membership dues at \$220 and annual corporate dues at \$260. Upon a motion by Mrs. Hartman and a second by Mr. Logan, the Board approved name badge fees at \$25 and initiation fees at \$15. Upon a motion by Mr. Hull and a second by Mfrs. Shultz, the Board approved the proposed 2021-2022 operating budget, as presented.

CLUB SERVICE:

Mrs. Hartman reported that the Plain Rotary Club has been contacted regarding a date for them to drop off items for the Purple Bag project.

The Massillon Habitat for Humanity project is scheduled for October.

The River Clean-Up project is on hold until the Army Corps of Engineers completes its work on the levee. We are waiting for the Hammer & Nails projects to be scheduled in Massillon. Mr. Hartman hopes to revive the Rotary Corps. Two dates for Meals on Wheels need to be filled.

MEMBERSHIP:

We have received an application from Kelly Hirshfelt and Mrs. Shultz is following up with her. Lauren Berbari is scheduled to be inducted on August 5th.

Mrs. Shultz has contacted Andrea Scassa. of the Massillon Courts to encourage her to consider joining Rotary. Kathy is currently reviewing the orientation materials to see if any updates may be required.

MASSILLON ROTARY FOUNDATION:

Mr. Logan reported that the Foundation had recently awarded one additional nursing scholarship. The next Foundation Board meeting is scheduled for September.

INTERNATIONAL:

Dr. Leffler reported that our share of the funds for our international project have been submitted.

PROGRAMS:

Mr. Swartz reported that programs have been arranged for all four club meeting dates in August. The site for the club's social in September will be the Stone House.

Upon a motion by Mrs. Hartman and a second by Mr. Logan, the Board approved a fee of \$250 to use an area in the Massillon Museum for a meeting there in March.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

President Hartman asked the Board to provide some ideas for the club's fundraisers. He also raised the issue of vacancies on the Board, due mainly to the lack of opportunities to conduct officer and director elections during the pandemic. Upon a motion by Dr. Leffler

and a second by Mr. Logan, the Board approved the appointment of Richard Regula to fill one of the Director vacancies of the Class of 2021-2024.

NEXT MEETING:

The next regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Directors is Tuesday, September 7th, at 11:30am, at Kozmo's Grille.

ADJOURNMENT:

Upon a motion by Mrs. Hartman and a second by Mr. Hull, the meeting was adjourned at 1:10pm.

Please let me know if you can deliver our Meals on Wheels route on the following dates:

Here is some information to help you decide!

When you arrive to MOW office on Nave Road, you get the cooler bags of hot and cold food and an iPad. The iPad provides turn by turn directions to the homes on the route, the instructions for delivering meals and a place to sign off that the meal was delivered. When I did the route in July, it took about an hour to deliver the meals and then approximately 15 minutes to and from the MOW office to the route start and end for a total time of 1.5 - 2 hours of community service! If you have never done it before and would like to have someone go with you the first time, please let me know and I will try to pair you up!

2 - HABITAT FOR HUMANITY

We also have a fantastic opportunity to partner with Habitat for Humanity in October right here in Massillon! Details are below:

- **Date:** Saturday, October 23, 2021
- **Time:** 8:15am-2:30pm (workday may end earlier depending on the speed of the volunteers)
- **Meet-up Location:** 1621 13th Street SE, Massillon, OH
- **Tasks:** Porch Rail / Cattle Rail (Installing deck and stair railing. This task requires standing, bending, and kneeling. No prior construction experience necessary)
- **Number of Volunteers:** 4-6
- **Minimum Age:** 18
- **Notes:**
 - No prior construction experience is required to volunteer with Habitat for Humanity. We provide all of the supervision, training, tools, and materials needed to complete the task. All we ask is that you wear closed toed shoes and be ready to learn!
 - Please know that Habitat will monitor local and federal health and safety guidelines and implement any applicable restrictions that may be in place on the day you volunteer.
 - Habitat for Humanity does not provide lunch. Volunteers can pack a lunch or sometimes groups will pick-up / have food delivered to the site.

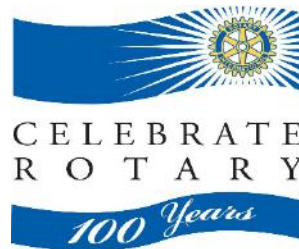
