

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING MINUTES AUGUST 2, 2022

The Board of directors met at Kozmo's Grille on Tuesday, August 2, 2022. The following members were present: Dan Swartz, Jim Stanford, Tom Jingo, Dick Leffler, Carolyn Worthen, Todd Loxley, Kathy Shultz, Chad Hartman and Matt Hull.

The minutes of the July 5, 2022 Board meeting were presented for approval. Upon a motion by Mrs. Shultz and a second by Mr. Stanford, the minutes were approved, as presented.

SECRETARY'S REPORT:

The July average weekly percentage of attendance by active members was 41%.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Mr. Leffler circulated a copy of the latest Accounts Aging Report and reported that several members had recently paid their outstanding balances and that the report was looking much better, with no serious individual concerns. Reminder notices will soon be sent to those with outstanding balances of over 60 days.

The proposed operating budget for 2022-2023 was presented. In that proposed budget, total revenues were estimated at \$29,100, with total expenses projected at \$29,100. After a thorough explanation of the budget process and some discussion, the following motions were advanced: Upon a motion by Mr. Hull and a second by Mr. Hartman, the Board approved Individual Member dues of \$55 per quarter and Corporate Member dues of \$65 per quarter. Upon a motion by Mr. Hull and a second by Mr. Hartman, the Board approved a New Member Initiation fee of \$35. Upon a motion by Mr. Hull and a second by Mr. Loxley, the Board approved the proposed operating budget for 2022-2023, as presented.

CLUB SERVICE:

Mr. Hartman advised the Board that his committee is exploring potential club projects in our service area for the coming year.

MEMBERSHIP:

The new Salvation Army Executive Officer, Major Hinzman, has been contacted regarding Rotary membership. The Salvation Army will be offered the options of Individual or Corporate membership.

MASSILLON ROTARY FOUNDATION:

President Swartz described the five basic funds that currently comprise the total assets of the Foundation. Those assets, at this time, total \$2,349,699. This year the Foundation has awarded over \$100,000 in grants.

PROGRAMS:

Mr. Stanford reported that programs for three of the four club meetings in August are scheduled, and that half the September programs are also scheduled. He has also begun to work on plans for the Massillon/McKinley luncheon in October.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

President Swartz suggested that the Board consider scheduling an outdoor post-game party, after the Massillon/McKinley game, as a major fund-raiser for the club. After some discussion the Board decided to organize a planning committee for that event.

NEXT MEETING:

The next regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Directors is Tuesday, September 8th, at 11:30am, at Kozmo's Grille.

ADJORNMENT:

Upon a motion by Mr. Hull and a second by Mr. Loxley, the meeting was adjourned at 12:55pm.
