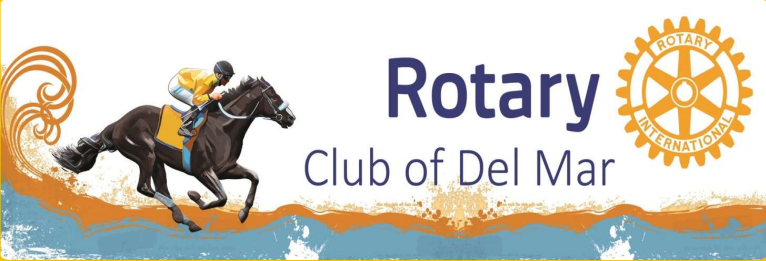

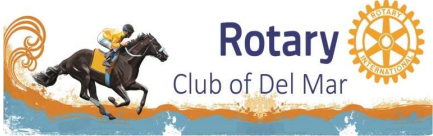

CITY SNAPSHOT

Del Mar: FHSZ snapshot

Expanded high-hazard areas
Updated maps significantly grew the High and Very High zones — including neighborhoods adjacent to open space.

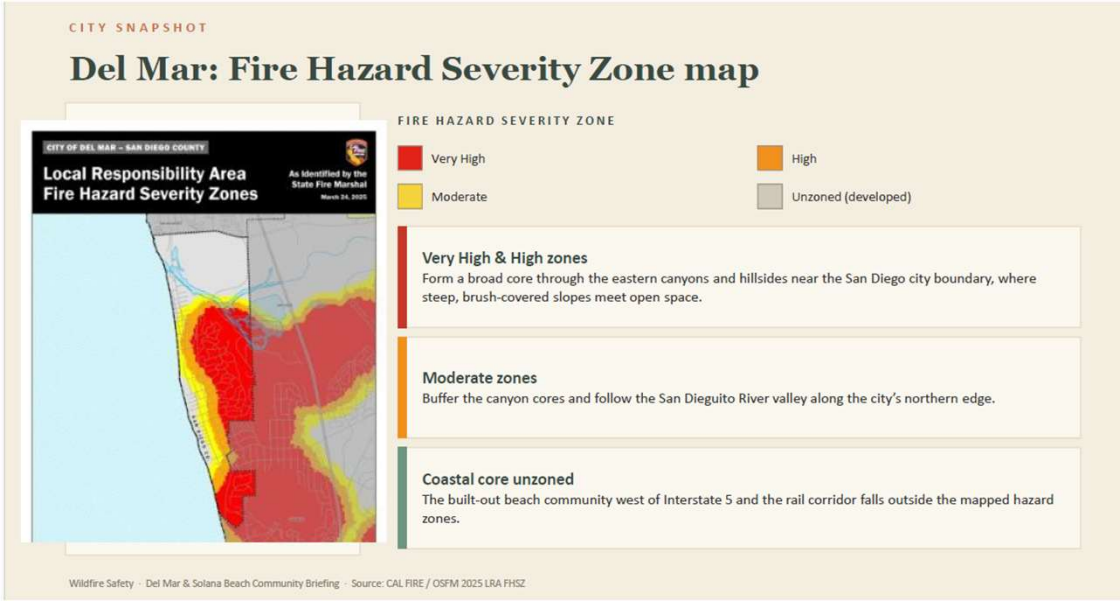
Adopted June 16, 2025
City Council adopted the ordinance to formally adopt the FHSZ maps after public workshops.

Stricter requirements follow
New construction in High & Very High zones must meet wildfire-resistant building standards (Building Code Ch. 7A).

Annual WUI inspections
The Fire Department runs annual Wildland-Urban Interface weed-abatement and fuel-reduction programs.

Residents can look up their property's zone on the City's public map viewer.

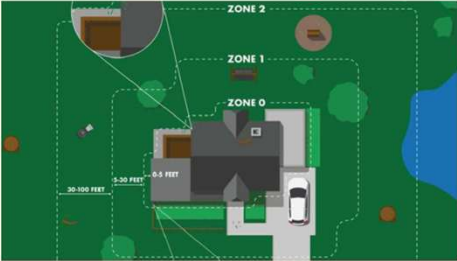

LAYER 1 · DEFENSIBLE SPACE

The three defensible space zones

California law (PRC 4291) calls for up to 100 feet of defensible space — a buffer that slows or stops a wildfire and gives firefighters a safer place to defend your home.



ZONE 0
0–5 ft

Ember-Resistant

The most important zone. Keep the first 5 ft free of anything that can ignite from embers.

ZONE 1
5–30 ft

Lean, Clean & Green

Remove dead vegetation, create space between plants and clear under decks.

ZONE 2
30–100 ft

Reduce Fuel

Thin and space vegetation out to the property line to break up a fire's path.

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ZONE 0
0–5 ft

Ember-Resistant Zone

Keep the first five feet closest to your home clear of anything that embers can ignite — this is the single most important zone.

✓ Use hardscape — gravel, pavers or concrete; no combustible bark or mulch.

✓ Remove dead plants, leaves and needles from roof, gutters, decks and under the home.

✓ Replace combustible fencing, gates and arbors attached to the home with noncombustible ones.

✓ Move garbage and recycling bins and limit furniture and planters in this zone.

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LAYER 2 • HOME HARDENING

How homes actually ignite



Direct Flame



Radiant Heat



Flying Embers

Direct flame

Contact from burning vegetation, fences or a neighboring home that has caught fire.

Radiant heat

Heat from nearby burning plants or structures can crack windows and ignite materials.

Flying embers

Can travel up to a mile ahead of a fire and slip into vents or gaps — the #1 cause of home loss.
