Camp Venture (Open to students going the summer before their senior year in high school.) Camp Royal (Open to students the summer before their senior year in high school.) Camp Royal is the Rotary Youth Leadership Award (RYLA) Conference organized each June in the mountains of northern California. This is a premier leadership training opportunity provided to worthy young people by our Rotary Clubs, as part of Rotary's Youth Programs mission. Rotary Interact Club This is open to youth from 12-18 who want to connect with others in their community or school. Interact club members have fun while carrying out service projects and learning

about the world. Interact clubs organize at least two service projects a year: one that benefits their community and one that encourages international understanding. Camp Royal has provided an incredible leadership experience to outstanding high school students from throughout Rotary District 5160. Camp Royal is set in northern California near Mount Shasta, away from all distractions like cell phones, internet and Face Book. High school students are transported to camp for an experience not likely to forget. Last year's participant's first words to describe the event were "Amazing" (Rebecca G.), "Life Changing" (Mia J.) and "Awesome" (Jonathan C.). "It is a camp that drives you to do something extraordinary, showing one it is Okay to fail, and what it truly means to persevere". "It builds your self confidence inside out and teaches you to rid yourself of that little voice that says you cannot do it".

The three Rotary Clubs of Woodland; Woodland Noon, Woodland Sunrise and Luna Vista Woodland, are proud to sponsor students from their community. Selections are based on the application, involvement in school and community, and personal statements. Woodland Rotary clubs are committed to sending students to this Camp.

Camp Royal emphasizes leadership objectives:

- 1. Campers will realize that they must take responsibility for themselves and the outcome of their decisions and future.
- 2. Campers will have an opportunity to collaborate in small teams to accomplish tasks they could not do alone and overcome obstacles.
- 3. Campers will experience the process of inspiring a large group to achieve a common goal.

The important outcome of this experience for the students is NOT the success or failure of any particular task or project, but rather the realization of how much more they accomplish in groups working together toward common goals - how to lead, how to follow, and how to be part of something larger than themselves. This is a remarkable outcome considering that most of these kids are leaders to start with, and are used to success and being in charge.

Last year's participants all discussed that it was more than expected, with activities that increase personal awareness and potential, defining goals and empowering one to move toward those goals.
