Area Presidents' Meeting Update Aug 01, 2011

On the fourth Monday of each month the Rotary club presidents from as far south as Rio Rico and as far north as Saddlebrooke and including all of theTucson area meet for breakfast along with District 5500 Assistant Governors to share the important activities of each of their clubs. Some items that were shared at the most recent meeting on July 27th included:

- <u>Catalina Club:</u> is trying to sponosr a Community Rotaract Club for 18-29 year olds. The next meeting is at El Parador on August 11th from 6-8 p.m.
- <u>Youth Exchange</u>: District 5500 has nine in-bound students. There is an August 31st deadling to place all of these students. Still need six clubs to step forward to sponsor six of these yet unplaced students.





















- <u>Foothills Club</u>: is hosting a Jazz Event featuring Norman Lyles on September 16th at the Tucson Community Center.
- <u>Cienega:</u> is working on their dictionary project with their Interact club at Empire School.
- <u>Saddlebrooke</u> is hosting a golf tournament, their major fundraiser, on November 5th.
- <u>September 11th Tenth Anniversary Recognition Event</u>: some clubs are organizing projects and events on the weekend of September 10th-11th to remember those that were lost on September 11th 2001. The deadline for clubs to sign up to participate is August 31st.
- <u>Rotary Leadership Institute</u>: on August 27th, the first of three Saturday courses will be held at the Vicount Hotel from 7:30-3:30 for new members and any members interested in future leadership in their Rotary clubs. The cost of the course is \$60 but each club has one scholarship available to cover the cost from District 5500.
- <u>Rincon Club:</u> working with Habitat for Humanity to try to build a home for a deserving family. Typically the home cost is \$140K and the new homeowner will carry approximately a \$90K mortgage. The downpayment would require a \$2500 donation by a club plus an average of \$25 per member in the District (we have 1700 members in our District). This would be a good PR project for our Rotary clubs and would offer a hands on opportunity.
- <u>Middle East Group Study Exchange</u>: The group from the Middle East will be visiting the Tucson area between October 22nd and November 20th. We can involve them in the EI Tour project as well as our Car Show. Host families are needed. If you are interested in hosting one or more of these group study exchange visitors, please let Bob Logan, Board Director of International, or President Joni know. These visitors will also be here during our District 5500 Annual Conference at the Doubletree October 28-30th. We hope to have good reresentation from RCoT at this conference.


