Dr. Lee Ryan - Aging and the Brain Aug 08, 2011

Dr. Lee Ryan completed her undergraduate work at University of Toronto, received a Ph.D. in Cognitive and Clinical Psychology at the University of British Columbia in 1992, and completed a postdoctoral fellowship at the University of California at San Diego. She is the Director of the Cognition and Neuroimaging Laboratories at the

University of Arizona, making magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) technology available to cognitive researchers on campus.

As an associate professor in the Cognition and Neural Systems program and the Clinical Neuropsychology program at the University of Arizona's Department of Psychology, Dr. Ryan teaches undergraduate classes in human memory and graduate level courses such as Human Brain Behavior Relationships, Cognitive Neuroscience, and Principles of Neuroanatomy. As a clinical psychologist, Dr. Ryan works with individuals and families who are coping with chronic and progressive diseases that affect cognitive functioning, including multiple sclerosis, Parkinson's disease, and Alzheimer's disease.

Rotary Club of Tucson Scholarships Aug 08, 2011

Our club committed to providing financial support for Tucson high school students (actually for Tucson High School students since that was the only high school in Tucson at the time) entering the University of Arizona almost 70 years ago and we have been doing so ever since. Well over 1000 students have received financial support from our Club over the years. By

the mid 80's we were awarding scholarships to 10 high schools but Scholarship Chair Jon Wang expanded our reach to 23 schools that included every public high school, 2 private schools, and Arizona School for Deaf and Blind. We did so for approximately 20 years. Each student was presented a Rotary Scholarship Certificate at their respective graduation or awards ceremony, and a Rotary Club member attended that ceremony to personally present to the student on behalf of Rotary Club of Tucson. Within the last decade as University tuition has risen we shifted the focus to fewer students and larger scholarships, focused on students with financial need, and we also offered scholarships to Pima Community College. At the same time, we decided to develop stronger relationships with the students by encouraging them to attend some of our meetings and/or events each year to gain a better understanding of Rotary, and by offering them additional scholarships for a total of 4 years if they meet certain criteria: attend 4 or more Rotary meetings/events each year, maintain a 2.5 GPA minimum, obtain recommendation from their school counselor, submit an application along with a brief narrative on a selected topic, and obtain approval of the Scholarship Committee. Over the years our Club has donated on the order of \$1,000,000 in tuition assistance for young people seeking higher education. Last year we donated \$24,800 to 12 UA students and 1 Pima student. This year we plan to support the same mix of students at the very same level. When our scholars attend our meetings and events, please introduce yourself, make them feel welcome, tell them about Rotary, and encourage them in their academic pursuits. Many of these kids are future Rotarians. Thanks to all of our members who have contributed time and money over the many decades to make this program a long standing tradition of supporting our community through higher education.
