Lisa Schnebly Heidinger, a Tucson native, has written a new book, "Arizona - 100 Years Grand", the official book of Arizona's upcoming centennial that we will celebrate on February 14th, 2012. She is contributing 20% of her sales proceeds towards the centennial celebration. As the recent closing speaker at our District Conference, Lisa shared that the date of our statehood was selected because it was exactly 50 years after Arizona became a territory. Our



territory was initially a Confederate territory. She points out that Arizona is unlike any other place. Arizonans are typically not native because so many of us have migrated from other places and because of this, there is no protypical person. Often, Arizonans don't play well with others. She points out that Arizonans are often independent types with a lot of diversity.

The women of Arizona have been strong and capable like Isabella Greenway, who after her second husband's untimely death, ran a 130,000 acre ranch in Williams Arizona, and became the owner and operator of the Gilpin Airlines. In 1930 she was started the Arizona Inn and then served as the sole representative to the US Congress in 1932-1936. Heidinger pointed out that the women had to be strong because they often had to run the ranches while their husbands were cowboying out on the range. Cowboys influenced the development of Arizona and the type of people that settled here. She shared that her own grandmother was Sedona Arabella Miller







Schnebly, for which the beautiful red rock town south of Oak Creek Canyon is named. Sedona was married to the town's first postmaster and was known for her hospitality and strong work ethic.

The tapestry of life is a theme that Lisa Schnebly weaves together in her book and she uses their stories to illustrate the history of our wonderful state. She points out that history is not nearly as precise or fixed as one might think....it is a very porous fabric. History truths may vary, such as the stories of Tombsone. No one really knows for certain if the stories about the gunfight at the OK Corral involving the Earps, Doc Holiday, the Clantons, and the McLaury's are accurate. All we know is what has been handed down through the years. With this example, she urged each of us to write down our stories to share them with our children, our nephew and nieces, and grandchildren so these stories will not be lost.
