Navy SEALs - an Instructor's Perspective Posted by Darrell Stewart on May 07, 2012



Jeff Utsch's career in distressed real estate has encompassed all aspects of the industry, including acquisition, renovation, management, lending and sales in the Tucson area since 1992. He graduated from University of Arizona in 1991 with a Bachelors Degree in Aerospace Engineering, where he also served as captain of the Swim Team. A champion swimmer, Jeff was a member of the US National Team 1984-87, Top 10 World Rankings 1984-1988, and NCAA All-American in 1988. He has since used his skill in the water to instruct others who serve our country in uniform. He is an Instructor to the Navy SEALs / Naval Special Warfare community, teaching Navy SEALs and support personnel specialized tactical swimming. Jeff created courses specific to NSW including: Tactical Swimmers Course, Instructors Course, and Advance Course. He has worked and contracted with SEAL Teams 1, 2, 4, 8, 10, NSW Group 2, and the NSW Center. In addition Jeff has taught Air Force Para Rescue Jumpers, Combat Controllers, Force Recon Marines,

Coast Guard MSST, and other military personnel. From these experiences Jeff has gleaned life lessons that he shares with audiences often. Now in his 18th year working with Navy SEALs, Jeff will present his view, as a civilian, of why SEALs serve, and what SEALs would have us do in response.

Do you know that one of your members lost his hearing in his left ear after falling out of a B-17 Bomber that was mounted on top of a gas station in Portland, Oregon? While this might explain some of his other behaviors, you might be surprised to know that this happened to our member Darrell Stewart. He really didn't offer much more than that, but perhaps we can cajole him into the rest of the story! Some of you do know that Darrell Stewart is the co-chair of our club's Home Hospitality committee with Lisa Fogle and that he has also been actively involved in helping with the planning of wine fellowship gatherings as well. Darrell has been a part of the invocation and environment committees. But what many club members might not know is that Darrell was previously a long time healthcare executive. Darrell graduated from Tulane University in New Orleans with an undergraduate degree in zoological studies. He received his masters in

hospital administration (MHA) from the University of Minnesota.

Darrell has had a varied and international career. He worked in Cairo, Egypt on a project for Mrs. Sadat's Wafa Wa Amal Society, designing a 1,000 bed medical center in 1974-75. He was the founding President of Alternare of Washington, a preferred provider organization





















(PPO) for naturopathic physicians, acupuncturists, and massage therapists contracting with insurance companies and managing 1.5 million lives. He spent twenty-three years in leadership of a multi-hospital system in Minneapolis, Olympia (WA), Tucson and Portland, Oregon. Darrell arrived in Tucson in 1985 to serve as the Administrator of St. Mary's Hospital and was named Chief Operating Officer of the Carondelet Healthcare System in 1991. Mike Harris first sponsored Darrell into the Casas Adobes Rotary club while he was at St. Mary's until he moved to the hospital system in Seattle. During his stint in Washington state, his office overlooked Puget Sound with a view of the Space Needle.

But even with this outstanding view, Darrell fortunately returned to Tucson in 2000 after deciding to take a break from working in health care to focus instead on real estate investments. **He quickly became immersed back in the community** serving on the boards of Open Inn Inc (for homeless youth), the American Heart Association, the Arizona Theatre Company, the Cancer Society, the Tucson Parks Foundation, and the Alzheimer's Association. He has had a long relationship with the Centurions of Carondelet St. Mary's Hospital and is a LIFE member.

Charlotte Harris sponsored Darrell into the Rotary Club of Tucson in September 2008 with the classification of real estate. Darrell is the CEO of DKS Trading Company, his Real Estate Brokerage company (staff of one per Darrell!) and is the President of a rental property company called R & D Development. He purchases homes, renovates them, and leases them out. He likes his role as landlord and has developed a variety of handyman and plumbing skills in recent years which proved to be useful last weekend when he helped to paint at the Primavera Foundation Men's Shelter.

Last week as I was heading through a neighborhood towards our RCoT Foundation board meeting, there was Darrell in the middle of the street carrying one of his small dogs and chasing another. One of his subcontractors had opened the door of one of his properties and Darrell's dog escaped. Fortunately, for all concerned, Darrell swiftly recued her from the traffic. In addition to remodeling and his dogs, Darrell likes old cars. traveling, biking, cooking, and hiking. Aren't our members just fascinating people with such diverse backgrounds and careers?!

President-Elect, Jim Lubinski and his wife Karen are there this week in Bangkok as are member Tom and his wife, Jewel Andrews. This year you can track the Convention daily on Facebook to see what is happening and see all of the beautiful sights of Bangkok. This past Sunday, RI President Kalyan Banerjee welcomed Rotarians from around the world to this year's first Plenary Session. He was surrounded by a huge beautiful symbol of this year's theme "Reach Within To Embrace Humanity."

As Banerjee traveled the world he has urged Rotarians to harness their inner resolve and strength to achieve success in Rotary. "In order to achieve anything in the world, a person has to use all the resources he or she can draw on. And the only place to start is with ourselves and within ourselves," he said. He offered,

"Discover yourself, develop the strengths within you, and then unhesitatingly, unflinchingly, go forth and encircle the world, to embrace humanity."

Banerjee has really emphasized the family as the starting point in serving others because communities are built of families. Good families, he said, lead to good neighborhoods, which lead to good communities. Over this past year, our club members have truly involved their family members in our club's activities. We've seen many Paul Harris fellowships given out at meetings to family members. Members have brought family members to help with our community work projects. Many family members have made important contributions to our annual Classics Car Show event.

This past year Rotary introduced a new avenue of service, "New Generations". You will hear much more of this in the coming year. Because of the impact of social media on our world, including Twitter and Facebook, Rotary is making necessary changes to link with younger people, who are the future of Rotary.
