# U of A Baseball Coach Andy Lopez Posted by James Ronstadt on Aug 27, 2012



In 11 seasons as the head coach at Arizona, Andy Lopez has reestablished the Wildcats as a national power on the diamond. Since taking over in 2002, Lopez has guided the program to a pair of trips to the College World Series, highlighted by the school's fourth national championship in 2012.

A three-time national coach of the year, Lopez's teams have earned postseason berths in eight of the last 10 years, and have won at least 40 games in three of the past six seasons. His 2012 club won a share of the Pac-12 Championship for the first time since 1992, which helped earn the Wildcats a bid to host an NCAA Regional for the first time in 20 seasons as they began their perfect 10-0 run postseason run at home in Tucson en route to the national championship.

Lopez came to the Old Pueblo from the University of Florida, where he spent seven seasons turning the Gators into a top 25 program and a national championship contender. His .636 winning percentage at UF was third-best for any coach in Florida school history that spent five or more seasons in the top spot.

He and his wife, Linda, are the proud parents of two daughters, Kristi and Kerri. They also have two sons, Michael and David, who were both members of the 2012 national championship team. David will again play for the Wildcats in 2013, while Michael has joined the coaching staff as an undergraduate assistant coach.

basis that, by show of hands, approximately 75% of our members had read the article in the funeral directors' magazine touting Mike's new business associate. Rotarians




are nothing if not well read.

The Founding of the Rotary Club of Tucson: Intrigue and Foresight.

Prior to statehood, a group of Tucson business leaders met at the Santa Rita Hotel every week for lunch and to hear speakers. University faculty and city and county officials bolstered the group. Many of the early attendees were members of Tucson and Pima County's pioneer families. The group was called The Tucson Luncheon Club. It passed resolutions and discussed civic issues. This group started out as a loosely knit cadre of citizens but by 1921, Jack Lyman, an architect, and Andy Martin, a druggist, were asked to seek out a national organization for the Luncheon Club to affiliate with.

In January of 1921, Lyman and Martin asked Orville McPherson to write letters of inquiry to Rotary and Kiwanis. The letters were written and mailed but no written response was received from either organization. On the morning of February 7, 1921, representatives from both organizations showed up at the Santa Rita Hotel with recruitment on their minds. Les Everts, Rotary District Governor of California, cornered Lyman and established a coalition of young returning World War veterans, who were denied access to the Tucson Luncheon Club, and a few members of the Tucson Luncheon Club.

Everts, obviously a problem solver, got everyone together upstairs in a private dining room at the Old Pueblo Club, and sold Rotary to the group. While this luncheon was going on, a similar organizational meeting was going on chaired by the Kiwanis representative downstairs in the Old Pueblo Club.

Twenty five charter members were selected shortly thereafter to start the Rotary Club of Tucson. With several of the returning World War Veterans included within the Charter member group, a strong consensus was built. The first Rotary meeting of our club was held on Monday at noon ,February 14, 1921, at Dickerman's cafe on East Congress Street. Twenty five charter members and twenty five prospective members were present. The average age of the twenty five charter members was 38. The cost of the meal was thirty five cents and the bill of fare was meat, potatoes,salad, pie, and coffee. NEXT- The Early Years.
