The Science and Business of Brewing Downtown Posted by Matt Blair on Dec 07, 2012

Science is hard work, but opening a business can be even harder. Mike Mallozzi is a postdoctoral fellow and Myles Stone is a med student at the

University of Arizona. Together with the brewmaster Blake Collins, they have managed to start a successful business in downtown Tucson. Mike and Myles will discuss the ins and outs not only of the science and art of making beer, but also of their experience in starting up a new business downtown.

Borderlands Brewing Company was started in 2010 by two close friends, Michael Mallozzi and Myles Stone. Mike and Myles met at a kick ball game organized by some mutual friends and soon after found they both shared a passion for craft beer. Mike and Myles began home-brewing beer together and it was long after that the idea of starting Borderlands was hatched.

Myles, a native of Tucson, grew up in a small business family and often worked in his parents' successful chain of bike shops in town. After high school Myles got his B.S. in Bioengineering, at the UCSD in San Diego. In between exams Myles was able to explore San Diego (one of the premier cities in the craft brewing world). With well over 20 craft breweries San Diego is certainly a focal point of the industry on the west coast. After finishing his degree Myles returned to Tucson where he get his Masters is public health at the University of Arizana and is currently in his 2rd

where he got his Masters in public health at the University of Arizona and is currently in his 3rd year of medical school at the U of A.

Mike, a native of Colorado Springs, moved to Fort Collins to get his B.S. in microbiology at Colorado State University. Fort Collins (home of Odell Brewing Company and New Belgium Brewing Company) is also a mecca of microbreweries, and an example of how a small local brewery can become a nationally recognized power house in the microbrewing industry. In his last year of college Mike took a job at the Budweiser brewery in the quality assurance department. Although it was a perfect job for college (Budweiser gives away 3 cases of beer to each employee every month), ensuring the "quality" of mass-produced beer was less than rewarding. After

Soon after starting the company, Mike and Myles met Blake Collins. Blake is one of Tucson's most respected homebrewers, and has a wealth of professional brewing experience. Blake acted as an unofficial adviser to the brewery for several months before Mike and Myles asked him to join Borderlands as the head brewer. Borderlands (located in a 100 year old historic produce warehouse) is now one year old and is thriving in downtown Tucson's current renaissance. Borderlands is currently in the middle of a major expansion and will be re-opening with a much larger capacity in early Jan 2013. Come and check us out next year!

In 1969, The Rotary Club of Tucson President George Hawke successfully partnered with the Salvation Army in what has become a Holiday Tradition. Bell Ringing. Rotarians and family and friends, wearing red Santa hats and Rotary shirts, and cheerfully standing by kettles at local retail outlets have raised thousands of dollars for the Salvation Army. This year's event is scheduled for

Saturday, December 15, 2012. This is Pat Lennan's second year to lead this project. Pat says he cannot remember how many years he has participated in Bell Ringing. He says it is one of the most rewarding experiences of his life. Along with his wife, Darleen, and fellow Rotarian Lee Aitken and his wife, Judy, Pat handles the hectic organizing and planning of this vital one day event.

Last year, \$6,500 was raised in a single day of Bell Ringing by the Rotary Club of Tucson. 114 Rotarians, family, and friends manned 14 kettles. This year, Pat will also have to staff 14 kettles. Each two-person shift is for two hours. As of December 4, there were 81 signups. 31 more signups are needed. You can sign up on Club Runner or call Pat Lennan at 742-1999 or Lee Aitken at 579-8392. Participating retail outlets include Safeway, Walgreens, Bashas', Walmart, Dillards, and Fry's.

Pat Lennan reminds us that the \$6,500 we raised last year enabled the Salvation Army to buy over \$65,000 worth of food for needy Tucsonans. If you have some free time on Saturday, December 15, sign up for a shift. It is a pleasant and worthwhile use of your time and it sustains a tradition of almost fifty years of the Rotary Club of Tucson partnering with the Salvation Army to bring Holiday
