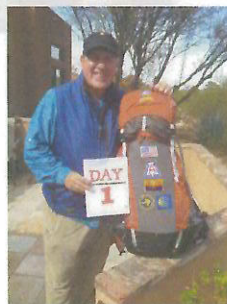
Camino del Santiago Hike

Major Clement Leslie - The Salvation Army

Major Clement Leslie (Clem to his friends) and I met at Rotary and were New (Red Badge) members around the same time in late 2009. Clem has been a Rotarian in several clubs throughout the United States while being in the service of The Salvation Army. Clem was born in Trinidad (the southern Caribbean) to parents who were also Salvation Army Officers. His parents did quite a bit of island hopping in the service of The Salvation Army and it seems that each time they hopped, a child was born. They moved to British Guyana (now the Republic of Guyana) where the oldest sister was born, St. Vincent where two brothers were born, and to Jamaica where Clem's youngest sister was born. Clem eventually settled down in Barbados where he attended

high school. On his return to Trinidad, he met and was smitten by a pretty girl, Evangeline. He was so love struck that when she moved to Wilmore, KY to attend Asbury College in 1974, he decided to follow her... well he really didn't look at the map and ended up moving to Washington, D.C. where he had hoped to pursue his dream of being a jazz musician playing the trumpet.

Well, determination is one of Clem's characteristics, and he was bound and determined to close the distance between him and Evangeline. He took a bus through small towns in the mid 1970s to visit her in Wilmore, KY where she was attending college. With faith and determination, and many long distance phone calls, he married Evangeline in 1977 and they both entered The Salvation Army School for Officers' Training in 1978. They were ordained as Salvation Army Officers (pastors) in 1980 accepting their first assignment in Henderson, KY. Clem has traveled extensively with The Salvation Army from the east coast to the west coast and has been a member of many Rotary Clubs in each of the cities that he has worked.

Along the way, Clem attended and graduated from the TC School of Law in Richmond, VA and at The Salvation Army's School for Officer Training in Rancho Palos Verdes, CA, he taught Business Procedures and the New Testament. The Salvation Army moved Clem to Alexandria, VA where he was the Director of Public Policy and Coordinator of the Faith-Based Initiative. He left The Salvation Army for a short period in 2004 to become a Contract Law Clerk and practice law, but returned to The Salvation Army in 2008. Clem and Evangeline are the proud parents of two adult children, Ryan and Joy, and one grandchild. (Google "Ryan Leslie" and you will be in for a real treat).
