Len Jessup, Ph.D.

Dean and Halle Chair in Leadership

Eller College of Management, University of Arizona

Len Jessup – Dean, Professor of Entrepreneurship and Innovation, and Halle Chair in Leadership – joined his alma mater, the University of Arizona's Eller College of Management, in May 2011.



In 2000, Jessup was recruited from the Kelley School of Business at Indiana University to head the Department of MIS at Washington State University (WSU). During more than a decade at WSU, he served in a variety of leadership roles, including Dean of the College of Business, Vice President of University Development, and President of the WSU Foundation. His most recent roles were Chair of the Department of Entrepreneurship and Information Systems and Director of the Center for Entrepreneurial Studies.

In his role at the WSU Foundation, Jessup led the transformation of the university's fundraising efforts, which resulted in doubling its overall fundraising totals and achieving record numbers of donors. During his tenure, the university received a commitment for the largest gift in its history and initiated its largest comprehensive campaign.

Jessup served as Dean of the College of Business at WSU and Philip L. Kays Distinguished Professor in Management Information Systems from 2002-2005. As Dean, he led a complete,

two-year reengineering of the business program which resulted in the successful AACSB reaccrreditation of the College in Spring 2004. Under his leadership, the College of Business embarked on a new strategic plan to lead a University-wide Entrepreneurship and Innovation Initiative, driven by the College of Business and its nationally-recognized entrepreneurship program.

Jessup has taught in entrepreneurship, management, and information systems, and has published, presented, and consulted on electronic commerce, computer-supported collaborative work, technology-supported teaching and learning, emerging information technologies, entrepreneurship, leadership, commercialization, technology transfer, and related topics.

His research is aimed at helping people better understand, commercialize, and manage emerging technologies, and other innovations. Recent work includes papers on open innovation, commercialization of radical innovation, new venture strategies, and social entrepreneurship. He has served as an associate editor of *MIS Quarterly* and as reviewer and editor on over a dozen other journals and conferences.

Jessup received his B.A. in Information and Communication Studies in 1983 and his MBA in 1985, both from California State University, Chico. He earned his Ph.D. in Organizational Behavior and Management Information Systems from the University of Arizona's Eller College of Management in 1989, and was awarded the Outstanding Ph.D. Alumnus Award in 2004.

He grew up in the San Francisco Bay Area, and has two children, ages 9 and 13.

Hal and Larry Adamson's ties to Rotary go all the way back to 1925 when their father, Harold, was recruited by some of the founding members to join the Rotary Club of Tucson. The club had received its charter in 1921 and Harold Adamson had founded Baum and Adamson, a retail tire



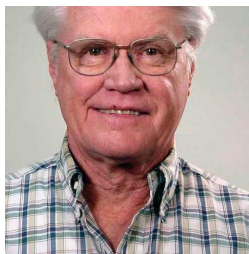
business, in 1923. Hal went into the family business and stayed until 1994 when he retired. Larry became a lawyer and still has an active practice specializing in Estates and Trusts. In the early days, the family business went beyond selling automobile tires. They expanded their business supplying mines with specialty tires and corrosion resistant rubber products to help

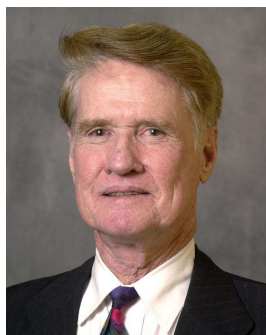
line the many tanks in the Arizona mining industry. Harold remained active in Rotary for many years and his sons followed him into the club.

Hal joined the club in 1956 and Larry joined in 1971. Hal was President in 1961-62. During his term, he redesigned the membership badge to reflect our local character by including cactus and mountains on the face of the badges. He also started the tradition of passing Scholarship Cups at the meetings. The expected donation at the time was a quarter. Hal enjoys pointing out to his brother that active membership was at

300 during his term of office and shrunk to 295 during Larry's Presidency.

Larry was President during 1985 and 1986. He points with pride at a Party-Auction the Club hosted that year. Under the direction of Mike Anderson, over \$34,000 was raised. Larry says this was a landmark event since it was the most ambitious fundraising effort to date by the Club. Also during his term, Larry discovered a transplanted member from Chicago, Leland Case, who had never achieved a Paul Harris Fellow during his many years of membership. Larry promptly fined him \$1,000 and the fine was paid. Larry also prides himself on many other innovative ways he found to raise money through fines.

Hal points with pride to the fact that he maintained perfect attendance for 38 years and his brother only could muster 12 years of perfect attendance. Hal says the main difference in the Club now compared to the club during the fifties is that in the fifties there were more social activities. This has gradually changed over the years, the emphasis of the Club shifted to community service projects. Larry has been to 14 Rotary International Conventions. Both still are engaged in Rotary Activities. Hal was instrumental in the shaping and founding of the Tucson Classic Car Show and remains active in the administration of the Show. When asked what attracted them to Rotary, both agreed that the Rotary Club of Tucson was the premier service club in Southern Arizona in the 1950's and onward. In their opinion, our Club had the best and the brightest when they joined and feel that this has not changed over the years.
