"PHRs - The Future of Healthcare"

A look at how Electronic Personal Health Records can transform health and safety for individuals and business employees in the Tucson community. We'll demonstrate how easy this technology is to obtain and to use, and give concrete examples why it is truly the future of healthcare. The owners of a new PHR called GoPHR, will also explain why they chose to develop and launch their business in Tucson.

Biography - Tom Wiggin

Tom Wiggin is one of the owners of a new national company based in Tucson called GoPHR (Global Online Personal Health Resource). After two years of research and development, GoPHR launched to the public in September of 2012.

Tom and his wife, Jennifer, decided to create GoPHR after the passing of the HiTech Act of 2009, the Affordable Care Act, and the subsequent national debates. To Tom and Jenn, GoPHR was a way to get individuals engaged in their health care while the rest of the health community was working on upgrading to electronic records.

Before GoPHR, Tom was a professional actor and writer who had celebrated 31 years in show business.

As an actor, his numerous credits include starring roles on Broadway on Prime Time TV and on Daytime TV. Tom is best known for creating the role of Kirk Anderson on the long running soap *As the World Turns*.

As a writer, Tom has written scripts for daytime dramas, had a screenplay, *Gift of the Robin's Nest*, optioned and he recently completed his first novel, *The Client's Wife*.

Tom is the proud father of two grown daughters, Anna and Eliza.

Frank A. Zunno - World War II

What an honor to sit down with Frank Zunno, RCoT Rotarian of 23 years, at Beyond Bread on this beautiful, sunny Tucson April morning. I have asked Frank to provide me with some memoirs that would enable us to celebrate and acknowledge his 90th birthday. It is apparent that Frank's memoirs need more than just one breakfast and require several "readings." Joe Nevin and Jerry Harris have given me some suggestions and perspectives. Bob Shaff felt it appropriate to publish two or three "chapters" on Frank; "World War II" is the first.

Frank grew up in a loving Catholic family in Brooklyn with one younger sister, Kathy. Even as a high school senior, he indicated his desire to be in law enforcement. World War II interrupted his plans: Frank enlisted, trained and parachuted with the 17th Army Airborne Division at Fort Benning, and was then on his way to

Britain, France, Belgium, Luxembourg and Germany. It was a natural for Frank to be part of the 17th Airborne Division Military Police Platoon. Frank has given me a history lesson on the Battle of the Bulge in late 1944 and the Wesel "Operation Varsity" in 1945 in which he participated. The 17th Airborne Division, known as the "The Thunder from Heaven," had the most casualties in a single day in airborne history at Wesel. Despite the cost in lives, "Varsity" achieved all of its objectives, assisting in the final conquest of Nazi Germany and meriting a Presidential Unit Citation. The 17th Airborne Division had four Congressional Medal of Honor recipients—more than any other Division.

Frank volunteered that while finishing his European tour in Berlin, he cared for a "rescue" German shepherd dog and negotiated an adoption back to the States, "Devil" arriving in New York even before his master. That accomplishment became a legend on Highland St. in Brooklyn, even impressing Frank's teenage coed neighbor, Lynn. A marriage to Lynn Philibert followed that 1946 homecoming and NY parade. Frank, although passing the NYPD Civil Service Exam, invested in a
