Additionally, Marc and his business partner Jeff were featured in 14 episodes of National Geographic's "Animal Extractors". They have also appeared in documentaries and news excerpts with National Geographic Wild, Fox News, CNN, and Telemundo. Marc is regularly seen on local news channels with exciting stories about wild animals and advice for the viewers regarding snake-bite prevention and/or conservation issues in the Sonoran Desert.

Asians all live in a crowded and volatile political climate. When Pakistan achieved independence in 1947, it became a favorite immigration destination for Muslims in India. During the Afghan war with Russia, Pashtun Muslims flocked to Karachi. They are mostly Taliban sympathizers. A sea port on the Arabian Sea, Karachi is the main banking and commercial center in the country. Formerly, the capital of Pakistan, this title now belongs to Islamabad. Karachi is notable for its surrounding scenery. Just a few miles from some of the worst slums in the world, Cape Monze, on the edge of Karachi, features beautiful cliffs and beaches. Like Tucson, Karachi has a monsoon season beginning in June and ending in August. Over a hundred inches of rain falls during this three month period.

The Rotary Club of Karachi was founded in 1933. At present, it has 130 members. Projects include a literacy project, a public computer center, and an acclaimed artificial limb project. But the project with the most global impact is the Polio Eradication program that is coordinated with the World Health Organization. Two years ago, Pakistan's rival in everything from trade to soccer to politics, India, was declared Polio free. The World Health Organization hinted that it might issue travel warnings for Pakistan if efforts to eradicate the disease were not embraced and furthered by the government. In an effort to avoid the WHO's wrath and to catch up with India, the Pakistani Government got behind the Polio eradication effort, sort of. The government hired many vaccinators and paid them \$2.50 a day. The wages for the volunteer vaccinators has now been raised to \$5 a day. In addition, armed police sometimes accompany vaccinators as they go into particularly dangerous areas. Mobilizers were enlisted and sent out into the schools and mosques to counter the rumors that the polio vaccine contained pork, or HIV, or birth control hormones. Favorable fatwas were issued by some Mullahs. Unfortunately, there are some areas of the country that are simply not under government control. Three hundred thousand children cannot be reached for vaccination because the Government has no power in certain hostile regions.

At the forefront of this effort are the Rotary Clubs of Pakistan. Progress has been made. A few years ago, 39 sub strains of the Polio virus were present in Pakistan. Now, it would appear, there are only two. Rotary Pakistan has sponsored a new and successful tactic to reach children who live in areas too dangerous for vaccinators. Transit point vaccinating utilizes toll booths and military and local police checkpoints as bases. With the implicit approval of the military and local police, Rotarians and other volunteers vaccinate as many as 800 children a day at these checkpoints as refugees and travelers try to enter the city of Karachi.

Abdul Waheed Khan was a large, gregarious man who welcomed the Rotary into his school in Karachi. He was not a Rotarian but he was a member of a Rotary Auxiliary group and worked with Rotarians on a daily basis to advance vaccination efforts. His school admitted girls and instituted a liberal arts curriculum that did not include study of the Koran. These efforts angered the Taliban who issued a fatwa calling for his death. He was a vocal supporter of the Polio vaccination program and allowed his school to be the base for some of the vaccination efforts. In March of this year, he hosted Dr. Robert Scott of Canada, who is chairman of Rotary International's Polio committee. Together, they vaccinated children at his school.

After the death threats, the only security Mr. Khan could get was an informal bicycle escort as he rode through town. On May 13, Abdul Waheed Khan was killed by gunmen who also shot his one year old daughter. Fortunately, she survived.

Recently at the main train station, the Karachi Rotary Club set up a booth to meet new immigrants so they could vaccinate their children. Rotarian Muhammad Arshad helped meet the crowd. He stood out among the turbans and other traditional native dress. He was wearing a blue baseball cap with the bright yellow wheel of Rotary International prominently displayed. He looked for children leaving the train and convinced most of their parents to have them vaccinated. When asked by a reporter from the New York Times this month about his personal fear, he said, "This is good work and God will protect me." Even at the railroad station, friendly Pakistanis came up to the Rotary table and told the volunteers their lives were in danger and they should play it safe and quit. Mr. Arshad ignored them and worked on.
