## "Wild Poliovirus" Posted by Jerry Harris on Oct 11, 2013

Through October 2, 2013, worldwide cases of new Wild Poliovirus infections have risen when compared to the same period in 2012. Last year, the world wide total was 134. This year, to date, the world wide total is 287 newly reported cases. The incidents last year were confined to four countries. Chad and the three endemic countries, Nigeria, Afghanistan, and Pakistan were the only countries reporting new incidents at this time last year. This year, Chad has no new reported cases. Nigeria had 73 cases at this time

last year. In 2013, only 49 have been reported year to date. Afghanistan is down from 19 last year to six this year. Pakistan is down from 40 last year to 36 this year.

The Horn of Africa is the new problem area. Somalia alone has reported 175 new cases this year. South Sudan has reported 3, Kenya 14, and Ethiopia 4. Also, the Wild Poliovirus has been detected in sewage samples taken in Israel, but no actual human infections have been detected and reported.

Rotary International has responded to the recent outbreaks by approving a \$500,000 grant to the World Health Organization to address the recent polio outbreak in the Banadir region of Somalia.

To date this year, five vaccination campaigns have been held in Somalia, three in Kenya, two each in Yemen and Ethiopia and one in Djibouti. Rotary has furnished emergency funding for vaccination drives in other countries. These grants are designed to swiftly address the outbreaks by funding massive vaccination campaigns.

A new area of concern is importation countries. These countries have at one time been polio free, but because of the explosive political situation in the Horn of Africa, cases of polio have occurred because of the countries' travel ties or proximity to the endemic countries. Refugees and refugee camps are a main part of the problem. These countries include the Central African Republic, Chad, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Ethiopia, Israel, Kenya, Liberia, Mali, Niger, Somalia, and Uganda.

The United Kingdom and Japan have recently made multimillion dollar grants to the World Health Organization with the funds specifically earmarked for polio prevention campaigns and vaccination programs in the Horn of Africa. This fall, massive vaccination programs are planned in the Banadir region of Somalia and in other crucial countries.

Soon we will be asked to sponsor riders in the Tour de Tucson. These sponsorship funds go the the Rotary End Polio initiative. A single vaccination only costs less than 60 cents. This will be a great opportunity for the Rotary Club of Tucson to express our support of the fine and effective efforts of Rotary International in the fight to end polio.

#### Reading Seed - Helping Every Child Read by 3rd Grade Posted by C. William Moore on Oct 11, 2013

We have more than doubled the number of Reading Seed volunteer reading coaches in our community — 607 new volunteers as of last week!

Reading Seed is a program of Literacy Connects that pairs trained volunteer

reading coaches with children in grades K-3 who are behind in their reading skills. There's no set curriculum. Children read books on subjects they like. Yet this informal approach yields results — faster reading gains than children without a reading coach.

According to the 2011 National Assessment of Educational Progress, 74% of Arizona 4th graders read at a level below proficient and 42% read at a level below basic. That's not good news, because children who don't read at grade level by the end of 3rd grade are four times more likely to drop out or fail to graduate high school on time.

I worked with the Arizona Daily Star to get the word out about this great program and the need for volunteers. Many thanks to everyone who volunteered or donated — including, of course, the Rotary Club of Tucson and the Tucson Festival of Books, long-time supporters of Reading Seed and Literacy Connects.
