Biography: Michael Keith

Local developer, Michael Keith, began work as the Downtown Tucson Partnership's CEO on May 10, 2010. Previously, Mr. Keith was president of Contemporary West Development, specializing in downtown historic restoration and new residential development. Projects included the restoration of the historic Cheney House in El Presidio, and the development of seven residential townhouses at Franklin Court.

Mr. Keith has been involved in numerous community-based projects including the Extreme Makeover project and the

restoration of historic façade and the marquee for the Screening Room theatre. In 2007, he led the effort that resulted in the preparation of the Downtown Infrastructure Study.

Keith is on the Steering Committee for Second Saturdays Downtown, and has served on the Boards of the Arizona Media Arts Center, WAMO, and the Fox Theatre. Awards include: The *Mayors Heart of Downtown* award, Southern Arizona Leadership Council's *Downtown Visionary Award*, the Sonoran Institutes *Building from the Best of Tucson Award*, and citations from the *Tucson-Pima Historical Commission*.

Its positive message, surreal desert beauty, and Southwestern "photo" mementos allow the viewer to absorb, smile and wonder; and then realize just what it is to be a Tucsonan, just how fortunate we are.

Chris' Artist Statement: "The Southwest shaped me. My childhood held many influences: Roy Rogers, the Sonoran Desert, and the sacrifice of a loving mother and

stepfather who have always been there when I needed them. Moving from New York when I was three years old, the Southwest grabbed a hold of my soul and awoke something within me, bigger than myself.

I've been lucky and fortunate to make a living from my childhood dream of becoming a photographer, and the work presented here is a sample of over 30 years of capturing the Southwest."

One might want to describe many of Chris' works as visual "puns" titled with amusing written "puns." The colors, which are almost neon in effect at times, highlight Southwestern subject matter and attract attention from some distance. Stephanie Aguilar, Receptionist and Inquiry Processor, volunteers: "This Gallery Show has been one of the busiest I've seen. Staff, students and the public will slowly walk by and eventually work their way in. I believe the attraction is that these photographs are 'home' to most of us, and we want to see our environment creatively."

I have always felt that there is an association between the creative spirit and the humanitarian spirit—the Rotarian service spirit, so to speak. Both give us a degree of satisfaction and completion that very few other activities can. Chris Mooney has got it and he shares it with us. I have asked Rotarians, Marianne Freitas and Richard Bratt, both who know Chris well and have the experience of his exhibition, to give us some insights.

PP Marianne: "We are most fortunate to have the talents of member Chris Mooney. Chris has continually and generously donated his photographic talents to our club . . . roster pictures, official photo of TCCS raffle car, the raffle ticket and flyer picture, photos on the day of the car show."
